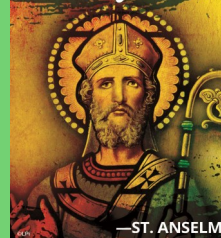

As summer continues to march on, now is a perfect time to take a step back and reorient ourselves towards God. One way to turn back to God is through prayer. Often time when we think about praying, we feel as if many factors need to be “right” before we begin. It is easy to get caught up in making the prayer experience just right: the right chair, the bible, notebook, candle, prayer cloth, etc. All these things can help foster an intimate conversation with God but my challenge for you is to choose prayer more often with some spontaneity.

St. Paul said that we should “give thanks and pray unceasingly.” An unceasing prayer does not mean to be constantly talking and saying prayers. Rather it is a mind shift towards offering each moment to God. This can be a challenge at first as we have to consistently train our mind to incorporate God into all that we do.

Below are some ideas of how to pray at home. I encourage you to choose a few of these to adopt and develop into family habits. Building habits takes time and consistency so remember that quantity is not as important as the quality of the prayer.

1. Teach your children the traditional prayers (Our Father, Hail Mary, etc)
2. Pray before meals together, whether a standard prayer or a spontaneous one.
3. Say an Our Father whenever you start a long car trip.
4. Keep a jar for special prayer intentions or requests.
5. Start or end your day with a couple minutes of quiet prayer.
6. Turn every worry that drifts into your thoughts a prayer / offering to God
7. Pray for the drivers around you, the people ahead of you in the checkout lane, etc.
8. Give thanks for your food at mealtimes: from the farmer, to the picker, to the grocery store worker.
9. Pray at bedtime for someone who did a kindness to you today.
10. Reach out to a family member or friend you haven't talked to since the pandemic started and check in on them. Listening is a great form of ministry.
11. Offer a prayer when you're facing an unpleasant task.
12. Say a short prayer of hope such as “God, help me to use the gift of this day to its fullest.”
13. Say a prayer when you feel tempted to do or say something you know is not right.
14. Pray for a teacher by name in your child's school.
15. Say a prayer for guidance when you are at your wit's end and don't know what to do next.

Making a Difference - Our Story

Ripples of Hope was founded by a small group of parishioners after reading a book "Fields of the Fatherless" by Tom Davis. During biblical times, God instructed His people to always leave a portion of their crops for those in need. Today, God's heart continues to beat for the poor, the widows, and the fatherless. The author encouraged us to move beyond words and become Christ to those in need. We began our ministry in 2014 and have been active in reaching out to those less fortunate and being Christ to our fellow man ever since. With the retirement of Sister Annette Koss, Ripples of Hope and the Social Concerns Ministry joined together after deciding that our goals were similar. Social Concerns donates money to agencies that provide many needed programs throughout the Fox Valley such as Pillars, B.A.B.E.S., LEAVEN, Healing the Children, Jakes Diapers and many other organizations. We always invite parishioners to become the Hands and Feet of Jesus with each of our endeavors.

2014: Provided Thanksgiving meals to families in need

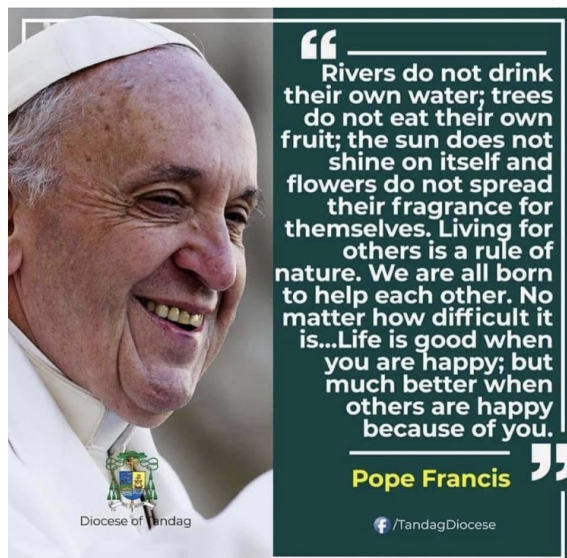
2015: May Day baskets of flowers or candy to neighbors around our two churches to reach out in friendship

2016: World Relief: Parishioners donated needed furniture to immigrants from foreign countries settling in Appleton

2017: Shopko donated \$500 to Adopt a Family at Christmas. Families were provided gifts by parishioners to help make Christmas special. Meals were also gifted. Adopt-a-Family has become a yearly event in our parish.

2017: Holy Spirit partnered with First English Lutheran Church in Appleton to pack food for Feed My Starving Children.

2018 - Present: Ripples of Hope introduced "Twinning" (or partnership) with St Anthony Parish in Neopit. Their food pantry is our main concern as it was nearly empty. Father Bob Kollath supported our desire to reach out and assist St Anthony with a monthly food drive. We call it Sister Parish Sunday.

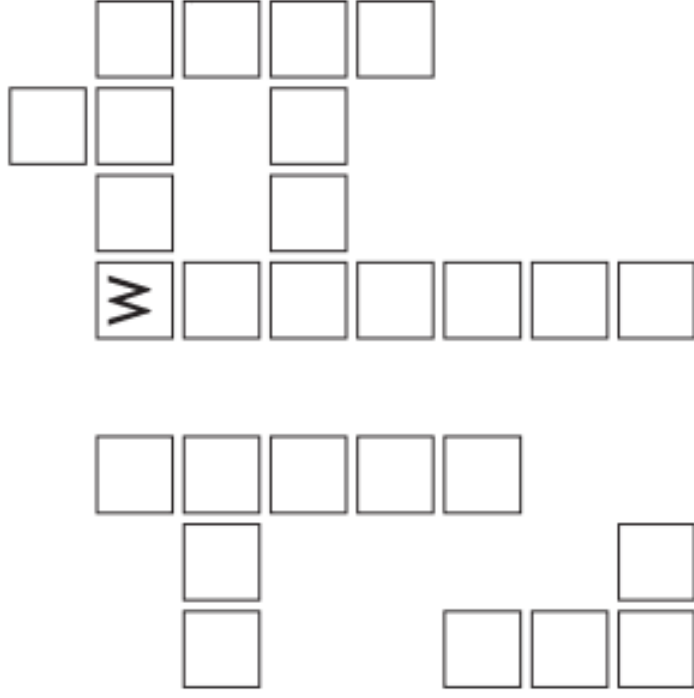

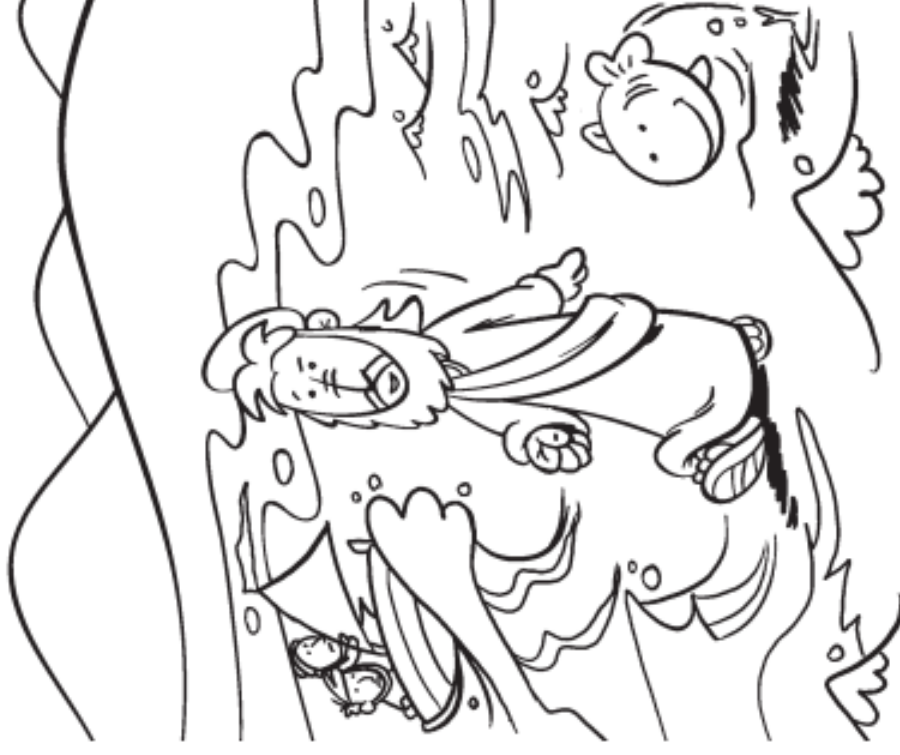
