

#### LET US GO UP TO JERUSALEM TO DIE AND RISE WITH CHRIST

With glad shouts of *Hosanna*, we embark on yet another Holy Week. If we are truly seeking to break away from *the crowd* to become more intentional disciples of Jesus, we will do our level best to participate with devotion in the Services of Holy Week especially *The Sacred Three Days* (*Triduum*)!

On **Holy Tuesday**, the truly devout are invited to gather at the **Cathedral at 6pm** for the **Chrism Mass** during which the *Sacramental Oils* are blessed and consecrated. This is also the Mass during which **Fr. Jack and all the priests will rededicate themselves to faithful service in the Church.** Your presence will be a visible sign of love and support for our priests. You need to be there by 5:30pm for a seat.

On Holy Thursday at 6:30pm we will gather to receive the Sacramental Oils which were blessed and consecrated at the Cathedral. On this night, we are commemorating the events that occurred at The Last Supper: The washing of the feet and the institution of the Eucharist. This is also the night on which we welcome into full communion with the Catholic Church those who were baptized in other Christian communities. They will profess their faith, be confirmed, and welcomed at the table of the Lord. Being confirmed also on this occasion will be a few Catholic adults who didn't get a lot of religious formation after first communion. Following this Mass there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until midnight. "Will you wait one hour with me?" It concludes with Night Prayer beginning at 11:45PM.

On **Good Friday at 6:30pm** we will gather to listen to the Passion According to John proclaimed in parts; to participate in the *Great Intercessory Prayers;* **to venerate the wood of the cross;** and to receive Holy Communion. This is the one day of the year on which the celebration of Mass is forbidden. As this service concludes, each person or family is invited to approach the cross and venerate it according to custom. This is always very moving.

On **Holy Saturday at** 8:15pm, we will gather for the **Solemn Easter Vigil.** This begins with the *Service of The Light* and *The Service of the Word* in which we listen to the Story of our Salvation. This is the night on which we initiate our catechumens through the *Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.* And as we celebrate this first Mass of Easter, all of us will be given the opportunity to renew the promises of our baptism after which we will be sprinkled with fresh *Easter Water.*



#### **ABORTION AND CHILD ABUSE**

Abortion teaches us that violence is an acceptable way to deal with difficult life problems. It teaches us that human beings are only valuable if they meet certain criteria, and it teaches us that the strong have a legal right to kill the weak and defenseless. When the unique vale of individual human life is trampled upon, society inevitably suffers.

Abortion advocates argue just the opposite. They purport that aborting "unwanted" children will reduce child abuse, neglect, poverty and violence and will generally lead to happier families. However, our experience since 1973 proves that this theory does not work. During that time, over 60 million "unwanted" babies have been denied the right to live, yet we have more crime, more violence, more dead-beat dads, and more gangs. The list goes on.

In the final analysis, it is only logical to conclude that societies who are willing to abort children before birth will be far more likely to abuse them after birth. Abortion is child abuse, and it is the most severe form of abuse in existence.

#### **ENHANCED BUILDING SECURITY**

The new door security system is now in place. This involves the main doors to the church, the west door near the parish offices, and the southeast door that leads to the RE classrooms. We are now able to electronically lock and unlock these doors according to a schedule. We can also issue codes to individuals who need to gain access to the building at other than scheduled times.

This week we changed the locks on all the exterior doors. Individuals who have been issued keys to those doors need to turn them in to Jane Mitchell at the parish office. Henceforth individuals who need access to the building outside of the schedules times will be issued a code. When all is said and done we will have an ongoing and accurate record of all individuals who have been issued codes and/or keys (to interior doors such as the kitchen, Joyce Center, Nursery, Sacristy, Gift Shop, etc.)

The front doors of the church will ordinarily be locked. Parishioners and visitors will be directed to enter by the West Doors near the parish office. The church will continue to be open during the day by entering through the chapel or the west doors. Because there is no one to observe who comes in and out by the main doors, this change addresses a significant security risk.



20% of the \$860,000 (\$172K) will be returned to us as the pledges are fulfilled. We will add that to building funds on hand to construct a 5K square foot expansion of the Youth Building for additional meeting and recreational space which will include a 1K sq. ft. new site for our Food Pantry. Since we have exceeded our goal by \$308,355 THUS FAR, one half of that amount—\$154,178—will be divided between gifts to the Missions in Guatemala that were served by Fr. Rother and a Catholic School Scholarship fund.
