

#### CHRIST IS RISEN AND IS REALLY LIVING AMONG US

A few weeks ago, reports appeared in various media alleging that most Catholics don't believe what the church teaches about the real presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This led to blog, internet, magazine articles and videos by various bishops and priests accepting the polling data at face value and offering explanations and solutions. FB articles also spurred great debates among Catholics of varying opinions.

So what are the facts? First of all, those conducting the poll demonstrated an inadequate understanding of Catholic teaching by the manner in which they posed the question. In essence it asked whether the person making the response believed that the Body & Blood of Christ was **really** present in the Eucharist or just present in a **symbolic** way. Practicing Catholics, by about a two thirds majority, responded really present. But when you aggregated all respondents who said they were Catholics, about two thirds responded symbolically. In Catholic theology the words sacramental and symbolic may be used interchangeably because the church teaches that the sacraments are sacred symbols instituted by Christ to give grace. In everyday American English, the word real is used to connote something physical. But the Church doesn't teach that Jesus Christ is present physically in the Sacrament of hid Body & Blood but that he is really present in a sacramental manner. For those few Catholics who have even a slight grasp of the theology of St. Thomas Aquinas, the term transubstantiation means that the underlying substance of bread and wine are transformed into the Body & Blood, Soul & Divinity of the Risen Christ, while the appearance (shape, texture, color, taste) of bread and wine remain. The church has never claimed that if you put the consecrated sacrament under a microscope or subjected it to a chemical analysis, there would be a detectable change. As St. Thomas put it: What our senses fail to fathom, we must grasp with faith's consent.

Our focus, I submit, should not be on philosophical or theological arguments about how the Risen Christ is really present in the Eucharist, but on the effect of his living in and among us in our day to day lives. Christ is really present in his Saving Word, in the people gathered in his name, in the ministry of the church, and most especially in the Holy Eucharist. But the proof of his presence is to be found in the ways that we love one another, forgive one another, and reach out to come to Christ's help in those most in need.

This year conducted by pharmacists from Walgreen's at 12<sup>th</sup> & Santa Fe. Insurance (Medicare too) will be billed by Walgreen's. The high dose vaccine is recommended for those over 65. Regular vaccine will be the quadrivalent (4 kinds flu viruses). A small number pneumonia vaccine will be available. Pre-registration forms will be available after the weekend mass on September 29<sup>th</sup> and on October 6<sup>th</sup> (at the flu clinic). Please complete form and turn in by October 1<sup>st</sup> if possible.

- Please note cost for quadrivalent flu shot is \$40.99 and 65+ flu shot \$69.99



Do you have a child who will be attending discipleship formation classes? Do you use the nursery? Do you want to mentor or work with any of the youth of our parish? A principal requirement for any of this is certification through the safe environment program.
