RESUMED*****Are You Thinking That There Are No Young People Among God's Holy Ones?***

You might be very surprised, then, to know that just this October a 15-year old teenager was beatified. Blessed Carlo Acutis, an Italian Catholic schoolboy was born May 3, 1991. He was widely known as an amateur computer programmer who also found time to document what are termed "Eucharistic Miracles" around the world. He died from Leukemia on October 12, 2006. His extraordinary devotion to the Eucharist was a core theme of his life.

Blessed Carlo Acutis was committed to making an effort either before or after Mass to spend time reflecting before the Presence of Christ in the tabernacle. Seeking to be an evermore faithful Catholic he made weekly confessions and he studied the lives of youthful Saints like Francis of Assisi, Francisco and Jacinta Marto (of Fatima fame), Dominic Savio, Tarcisius, and Bernadette. He chose to say "YES" to the call to follow Jesus and as such he was very compassionate to those teens whose parents were divorcing. He would invite them to his home so that he could provide support to them during their difficult times. He also defended his peers who were disabled and were being bullied and mocked at school. Outside of school, he was active in volunteer work with the homeless and destitute.

As a testament of his love for Jesus, he noted on his Eucharistic Miracles website that "the more frequently we receive the Eucharist, the more we can become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven". Are we strong enough in our faith to profess the same? Are we willing to truly follow Jesus?

When he was diagnosed with leukemia, he said I offer all of my suffering for the Lord, and for the Universal Church. When asked by his doctors if he was in great pain, he responded that "there are people who suffer much more than me".

Again, are we bold, strong, and faithful to give our all for the well being of others and follow the Lord? Join us in the YDisciple adventure to experience an encounter with Jesus.

Many people, perhaps even most, give little or no thought to vital decisions that need to be made when the time for us to leave this world approaches. Advance care planning is a positive thing to do. The most essential thing any one person can do is to speak to your family, your loved ones, your doctors, and trusted clergy members regarding matters related to the time of our death. Make sure they know your desire to be faithful to the teachings of the Church. As difficult as talking about death may be, we should be having these conversations while we are young and healthy to most effectively plan for the time when we are not. Catholic funeral rites are a rich part of Catholic Tradition and offer many benefits for those who have passed as well as for their loved ones. We plan for all the important moments of our lives: marriage, buying a home, retirement...planning for the many decisions that occur near the end of life is no different. Whether someone is facing an acute illness, a long-term chronic illness or a terminal illness, advance care planning can help alleviate unnecessary suffering, improve quality of life and provide better understanding of the decision-making challenges facing the individual and his or her caregivers. Advance care planning is about doing what you can do to ensure that health care treatment and funeral arrangements are consistent with your wishes and preferences should you be unable to make your own decisions or speak for yourself. The speakers at the End of Life Presentation will look at some of these important issues from the Catholic perspective.
