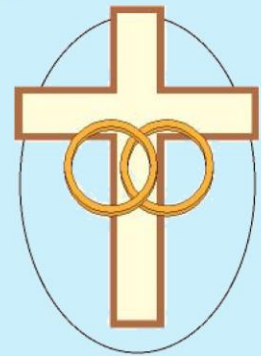

TWO GREAT EXAMPLES

Pope Francis and the retired pontiff, Benedict XVI, received their 3rd Covid vaccines this week

Not long ago, Pope Francis joined bishops in North and South America to encourage faithful and nonfaithful alike to receive the vaccine, calling it “an act of love.” The message was delivered as part of a media campaign to combat vaccine hesitancy.

“Thanks to God’s grace and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from COVID-19,” Pope Francis said in the message, adding vaccines must be made available for all through the collaboration of peoples and states. During Pope Francis’ news conference aboard the papal plane returning from his apostolic visit to Slovakia in mid-September, he seemed puzzled by the wave of skepticism surrounding vaccinations, which he noted have helped humanity overcome measles and polio.

Over the past almost two years, there has been a lot of references made to “following the science” with regard to matters relating to the Corona Virus Pandemic which has claimed the lives of millions including more than 700,000 Americans. Sadly, what constitutes reliable scientific data has been distorted by political and religious ideologies, by questionable posts on social and other media, and by every manner of unsubstantiated conspiracy theories. With regard to the vaccines, there’s overwhelming scientific data demonstrating that they afford vastly more protection from serious disease and death to vaccinated people vs. unvaccinated people. The fact that some vaccinated people have contracted a serious case of Covid or have died is not a valid argument against being vaccinated since like most other vaccines it does not insure complete protection.

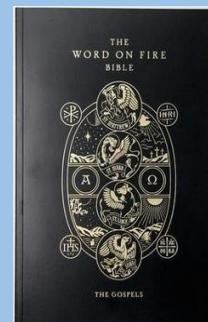

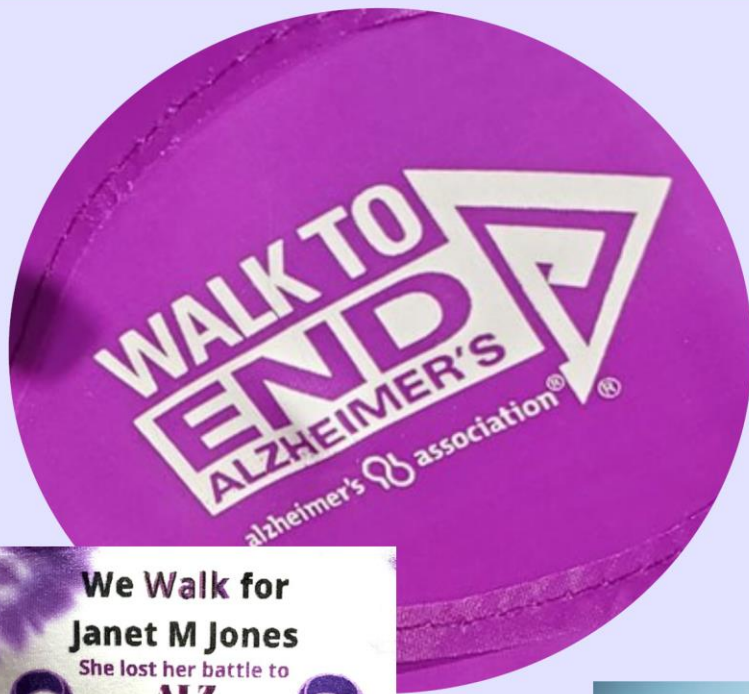
