


In the Gospel, we find that the demand of daily Christian living is to spend our life primarily searching for the Kingdom of God.


Youth Pilgrimage

BUILDING STRUCTURE

The structural engineers were at the church last week looking at the damage outside and inside of the church. These pictures are of the two exterior problem areas. Below is the outside of the building that would be across the street from the rental home we sold. (The North side) On the right side of the picture showing the fuller length picture, water has been leaking in near the joint of the wall that joins the chapel and the sanctuary. It appears the water was getting in due to failing caulking. The wood was wet and soft, but it was thought that the wood here might be okay and not need to be replaced after the water leak is fixed. The two other pictures are looking at the anchor that supports one of the big beams. There is some water damage to the wood, but the support looked good.

Here is a look at the outside of the church, east of the building, above the berm, that faces the rectory. The first two pictures show the wood degradation just above the other large support beam on the east side of the church. There is metal covering across the east side of the building here and the wood underneath it has rotted due to rain/water damage. The engineer suggested removing the entire wood on this side of the church (that you see in the pictures); replacing it with new wood and installing a thin sheet of metal inside of the wood to prevent future water damage. It was unclear exactly where the water was leaking from, though it could be from the gutters occasionally filling with too much water and leaking down the side of the building. The middle picture, which looks like something under water, is the deteriorated wood on the beam that is closest to the Station of the Cross garden.

Child and youth coats cost \$20.62 each. Teen coats cost \$25.36 each.





The Archdiocese of Oklahoma City through its programs, organizations and events, has numerous daily contacts with many children and young people. It is, therefore important that all Archdiocesan Personnel, clergy, seminarians, religious, employees and volunteers, protect the rights of children and be alert to the possibility for child abuse.

Under Oklahoma State law, all individuals MUST report an incident or suspicion of sexual abuse of a minor (person under 18 years of age) to the civil authorities. The Oklahoma Department of Human Services has established a statewide abuse reporting hotline for reporting: 1-800-522-3511. This number is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If you feel the child is in immediate danger of harm call 911.

For the safety of children and the healing of victims, the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City provides an Abuse of Minors Pastoral Response Hotline for reporting the abuse of a minor (in the past or present) by a member of the clergy or other church personnel: **1-405-720-9878**. The Archdiocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, a licensed professional counselor, will respond to calls to the Archdiocesan Pastoral Response Hotline.

A report to the Archdiocese does not relieve the individual of the duty to report child abuse to civil authorities as required by Oklahoma State Law. In Oklahoma, failure to report child abuse is a misdemeanor punishable by law.

To become a volunteer at St Andrew's, contact Ann Grover at agrover@standrewmoore.com, the St Andrew's safe environment facilitator, and she will provide instructions on becoming a volunteer and accessing the training portal.

The requirements to become a volunteer include creating a user account in the Safe and Sacred system, submitting a criminal background check, submitting three references to the parish safe environment facilitator to be checked, submitting and adhering to all safe environment polies and completing a safe environment training course in the Safe and Sacred training portal.

Training is required annually. Background check renewals will occur every three years and are aligned with the training cycle. When a user is required to renew their background check, the system will automatically direct them to ISP (Integrated Screening Partners) to complete the renewal process when they log into the system. After completing the background check, the user will need to complete their annual training.

The Safe and Sacred system will automatically send a reminder email to all existing users advising them of the need to renew their training. Please check your junk/spam box for this email from "Tech Support" if you don't see the email in your inbox.
