Saturday 5:30pm St. Mary,


Sunday 9:00am St. Joseph , 11:00am at St. Mary.




JUNE THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS



SAINT'S CORNER



June 24. Saint John the Baptist is one of the few saints who have two feast days. Today we celebrate his birth, which Saint Luke narrates in his Gospel. There Saint Luke draws a parallel between the births of Jesus and John, pointing out the important role in the history of salvation that Saint John the Baptist would play.



GIFT SHOP TRIVIA

Question: June 30th is the Memorial of the First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church. Who were these martyrs? Last week's question and answer: Why is St. Paul considered an apostle?

St. Paul whose feast day is June 29th is considered an apostle of Christ even though he was not one of the original 12 apostles. He fulfilled the same three requirements of the selected twelve. He was personally called by Jesus. He was taught by Jesus Himself. And, Jesus appeared to him after His resurrection.

St Paul, who was Saul before his conversion, was met by Jesus while he was traveling to Damascus three years after His Resurrection. Jesus appeared to him and asked him why he was persecuting Him. In Damascus, a holy man named Ananias was told by the Lord to go to Saul. Our Lord said, "Go for this man is a chosen vessel to Me, to bear my name before the Gentiles and kings and the children of Israel; For I will show him what great things he must suffer for My name." (Acts 9:15-16) St. Paul went to Arabia and stayed there for three years being taught by Jesus Himself and studying the Word. Thus, he too had three years of study with Christ as did the other apostles. Once St. Paul realized that spreading the word of Christ, was all that mattered to him, he gave himself to the church without any concern for dangers, suffering or tribulations that he endure for his faith. He died a martyr's death in 61 or 62 AD.

Adoration is in the Chapel from 9:00am until 3:00pm. Please continue to social distance.




