Liturgical Life

**LENT:** The Lenten season has a double character, namely to prepare both prospective Catholics and parishioners to celebrate the paschal mystery. The prospective Catholics, both with the Rite of Election and Scrutinies, and by catechesis, are prepared for the celebration of the sacraments of Christian initiation; the parishioners, ever more attentive to the word of God and prayer, prepare themselves by penance for the renewal of their baptismal promises (*Caeremoniale episcoporum*, 249). Lent began on Ash Wednesday (**06 March 2019**) and runs until the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (**18 April 2019**).

FORTY HOURS DEVOTION: The Forty Hours Devotion is a special forty hour period of continuous prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in Solemn Exposition. The focus is on the Holy Eucharist. The Forty Hours Devotion begins with a procession to the Thomas More Chapel after the 5:00 p.m. liturgy on Saturday 06 April. The Blessed Sacrament will remain on the altar during the next 40 hours for parishioners to gather for personal prayer. The Forty Hours Devotion will conclude at the 9:15 a.m. liturgy on Monday 08 April. This devotion provides a wonderful opportunity for the spiritual growth of our families. Please schedule a time to visit and pray before the Blessed Sacrament. See the bulletin insert for sign-up opportunities.

**THURSDAY EVENING PRAYER :** We are now offering Evening Prayer with Communion on Thursday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the Barn. The Thursday evening prayer will replace the morning service; there will **not** be a morning Mass on Thursday mornings. Daily Mass will continue to be celebrated on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 9:15 a.m. in the Barn.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE: Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 are obliged to fast and abstain from meat on Good Friday, 19 April 2019. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted. However, liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed. Selfimposed observance of fasting on all weekdays of Lent is strongly recommended.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS** will be prayed on **Fridays** in Lent through 12 April 2019 at **7:00 p.m.** in the church.

**HAIL, QUEEN OF HEAVEN:** The Marian antiphon, *Ave Regina Coelorum,* is sung from the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, 2 February, until Holy Thursday. At Visitation Parish, a traditional Marian antiphon is sung during the presentation of the gifts.

**ILIES:** All those preparing to receive First Eucharist in 2019 are asked to attend a special Mass with their families at 11:00 a.m. on **31 March 2019**, the Fourth Sunday of Lent. **INFANT BAPTISM CLASS:** Parents presenting their children for Baptism must be registered in our parish and are required to attend a Baptism Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism. The next class is scheduled for Saturday **13 April 2019** at 10:00 a.m. in the Barn. We encourage Sponsors/Godparents, including parishioners who will be Sponsors/Godparents elsewhere, to attend this Baptism Preparation Class. Attendance during pregnancy is advised. **FIRST EUCHARIST INTERVIEWS:** Before scheduling an interview, the sacrament of Penance/ Reconciliation must have been celebrated, the parental letter of request must be received, and the books must be completed and dropped off at the Parish Barn.

**SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION:** Following the policy of Donald Cardinal Wuerl, the Sacramental Programs for Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and Penance are parish and family based. For youth, Confirmation is a three-year program that begins in the sixth grade; Eucharist/Penance is a two-year program that begins in the first grade. Throughout this period of preparation, children are to be participating in a formal religious education program in our parish or in a Catholic school. Registration in our parish Faith Formation Program is separate from registration in our Sacramental Preparation Program. For information, call the parish office, (301) 948-5536.
