PASTOR'S PAGE

Last weekend began the Synod in Rome which the USCCB website describes as "a two-year process of listening and dialogue beginning with a solemn opening in Rome on October 9 and 10, 2021 with each individual diocese and church celebrating the following week on October 17. The synodal process will conclude in 2023". Cardinal Gregory has written the following to you about the Synod:

> The Holy Father has asked that bishops, priests and deacons follow Christ's example through this Synod process by engaging with our people, and those who have left our communities, through prayer, listening, dialogue and discernment. I would ask that you join me and the clergy of this Archdiocese in this Synod process. I believe this Synod is an opportunity to re-engage with each other as we emerge from this global pandemic. This Synod offers us the opportunity to be with each other, to invite our family and friends back to the faith, to listen to each other's joys and sorrows, and share our hopes and dreams for our parishes.

It's encouraging that the Church is meeting to discuss how to re-engage Catholics post pandemic. We at OLVP have been re-engaging parishioners and neighbors for the past few months, thanks be to God! The Preparatory Statement of the Vatican concerning the Synod takes our present and future activity of inviting people back to a higher level: "by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission".


