Liturgical Life

ADVENT: The Advent Season is a four week period of preparation for the great feast of Christmas. It is a "mini-Lent" in the sense that it is a time for us to properly prepare ourselves by praying, by fasting, and by performing works of mercy. St. Bernard of Clairvaux reminds us that in Advent, we celebrate the three-fold coming of Christ: 1) Jesus came to us once in flesh and human frailty (Incarnation); 2) Jesus comes to us now in Sacred Word and Sacramental Mystery (Each Liturgical Year); 3) Jesus will come again in great glory and majesty (Second Coming). St. Bernard also reminds us that Advent is a most appropriate time to honor Mary—patroness of our Country, our Archdiocese and our Parish. Advent begins today, Sunday, November 28, 2021.

PASTOR'S PAGE

Happy 1st Sunday of Advent! We know this is as a season of preparation that concludes with Christmas. And, Christmas celebrates the 1st coming of Christ. But, we believe that Christ will come again, so Advent is about preparing for His 2nd coming. This all might confuse us - "which coming of Christ are we focusing on in Advent?" It's okay to have that thought which I seem to have every year. The main point is to focus on the amazing reality of Christ coming into the world. The Old Testament readings at Mass during Advent take us back to the hundreds and hundreds of years that people were waiting for the Christ. This should help us to appreciate the Incarnation (the Word becomes flesh) and that we live in A.D. But, we are waiting, too. We are awaiting the Lord's return. Advent is the season that prepares us in the present time to be ready for the future coming of Christ.

We change the liturgical colors in Advent to violet (purple) Violet is a color of penance. Penance is a vital part of the Christian life because it helps us move away from sin. It's a great way to honor the coming of the Lord who came the first time so that we "sin no more". When He returns, will He find us trying to move away from sin? With penance in mind, we can approach Advent like we do Lent: give up one food or drink that we enjoy. Going without dessert or soda until Christmas might not seem like a big way to move away from sin in general, but it's a start in saying no to sinful appetites and desires. It's a small but solid way to prepare "the way of the Lord".

The main thing I'd ask you to do this Advent is attend our Parish Penance Service on Tuesday, December 21, 7 pm, in the church. Another priest will join me in offering the Sacrament of Penance (Confession / Reconciliation). Just like Confession before Communion, it's the best way to prepare for the Lord's coming.
