Second, we are grateful to all who purchased trees and wreaths. This event has been our largest fundraiser every year and this year is not an exception, thanks be to God. We were worried that it wouldn't happen this year because of the shortage of trees, but God provided. And as He usually does, He provided in abundance!

The atmosphere was electric and festive all weekend. It was so much fun to be here throughout to see the steady flow of cars into our lot each hour, our men delighted to greet and help people select and load up their trees, our women joyfully and carefully crafting beautiful designs on the wreaths, and the helpers in the "Christmas kitchen" making and preparing amazingly tasty and plentiful foods.
