## Liturgical Life

#### ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the church on weekdays, Monday through Friday, from 11:00 am to Noon and on Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. and on Friday evenings from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. during Lent.

**LENT:** The Lenten season has a double character, namely to prepare both prospective Catholics and parishioners to celebrate the paschal mystery. The prospective Catholics, both with the Rite of Election and Scrutinies, and by catechesis, are prepared for the celebration of the sacraments of Christian initiation; the parishioners, ever more attentive to the word of God and prayer, prepare themselves by penance for the renewal of their baptismal promises (*Caeremoniale episcoporum*, 249). Lent runs from Ash Wednesday (02 March 2022) until the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (14 April 2022).

FAST AND ABSTINENCE: Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 are obliged to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, 02 March 2022 and on Good Friday, 15 April 2022. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted. However, liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed. Self-imposed observance of fasting on all weekdays of Lent is strongly recommended.

#### PASTOR'S PAGE

Just like the old hide-and-seek game, 'Ready or Not,' here comes Lent! It begins this week, so we'll see you at Ash Wednesday Mass at either 7 am, 12 noon, or 6 pm. In the Ash Wednesday Gospel, we always hear the Lord's Lenten guidelines to pray, fast, and give alms. This applies to all of us. So, we have four days to figure out how we will fast and give alms which we usually refer to as giving up one thing (e.g., social media) and doing one thing (e.g., visiting the sick). If you're looking for one prayer or devotion to add in Lent, here are my top suggestions:

**Daily Mass** – the best way for Catholics to grow spiritually

**Adoration** - quiet time with Jesus

**Confession** – "be reconciled to God" (2nd reading, Ash Wed.)

**Stations of the Cross** – His Passion + ours

**Holy Rosary** – walk these 40 days with Jesus and Mary

Chaplet of Divine Mercy – take your biggest intentions to the Cross

**Sacred Scripture** – read a chapter of the Gospel and / or one Psalm every day
