ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT: This week, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the church on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 11 am to noon, and on Wednesday and Friday evenings from 6:30 to 7:30 pm. There is no Adoration on Thursday.

EASTER SEASON: The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better, as one "Great Sunday" (Athanasius, *Epist. Fest.*). These, above all others, are the days for the singing of the *Alleluia* (General Norms, 22). The days of the Easter Octave form the "early hours" of this "Great Sunday," with accounts of the Lord who rose early in the morning, and the early preaching of the disciples who were witnesses to His resurrection.

PASTOR'S PAGE

In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina to whom Jesus had appeared in the 1800s in Poland and revealed His divine mercy to the modern world. The Holy Father declared the Second Sunday of Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday, and the Church has been celebrating it ever since. "Diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska" contains all of the striking revelations that Jesus gives to us through her. They are so specific and generous! Below are some of the most pertinent, but I recommend reading her diary to capture the whole message of our Lord. It is so needed and welcome in our world.

I will be offering confessions today (April 16) from $12 \mod - 3$ pm in the church in order to gain the plenary indulgence that this Feast offers and is described below.

May you know the peace of the risen Christ, Fr. Greg

I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (plenary indulgence). On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. (Diary 699)

[Let] the greatest sinners place their trust in My mercy. They have the right before others to trust in the abyss of My mercy. My daughter, write about My mercy towards tormented souls. Souls that make an appeal to My mercy delight Me. To such souls I grant even more graces than they ask. I cannot punish even the greatest sinner if he makes an appeal to My compassion, but on the contrary, I justify him in My unfathomable and inscrutable mercy. (1146)

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy. (1109)

I demand the worship of My mercy through the solemn celebration of the Feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image (with the signature: "Jesus, I trust in You." 327) I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works. (742)
