PASTOR'S PAGE

While the temperatures have been dramatically inconsistent this year, they seem to be coming closer to normal and, thus, warmer in May. With that, I am seeing some people here break out their shorts when coming to Mass. The overwhelming majority of Mass goers have followed the following guidelines that I laid out last year. As I wrote then, I truly appreciate those who dress well and modestly for Mass.

...God does care how we dress for Church and Mass:

- 1. "Worship the Lord in holy attire" (Psalms 96 and 29, 1 Chr 16).
- "Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest – Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1387

The last part of the Catechism's statement is the main point for us as Catholics. When we come to Church, we enter God's House and the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. And, in Holy Communion, "Christ becomes our guest". Just like we show reverence and respect when we genuflect upon entering and leaving His Presence and bow before receiving Holy Communion, our clothing should show respect and reverence for Him.

This isn't just between each of us and God. There are other people to consider, namely our children. If we worship the Lord in holy attire, we convey to them that God's House is holy and that what happens at Mass is sacred. This will complement what we are teaching them in general and that what happens in Church is different and special. Also, it will help our children in their behavior at Mass.

So many people here come dressed well and modestly for Mass and I appreciate it very much. Similarly, it is inspiring to see our parishioners and guests show respect during Holy Communion. Let us all give honor to Jesus by worshiping the Lord in holy and modest attire:

 $Men-\ Modest\ suits,\ button\ down\ or\ polo\ shirts;\ dress\ pants;\ dress\ shoes.$

Women – Modest tops, dresses, or skirts; dress pants; dress shoes.
