ORDINARY TIME: Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, there remain in the yearly cycle those weeks (33 or 34) that do not celebrate a specific mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its fullness. This period is known as Ordinary Time (General Norms, 43). Ordinary Time resumed when the Easter Season ended, on Monday, May 29th, the day following Pentecost.

PASTOR'S PAGE

Last week we discussed what it means for a Catholic to be a servant leader in the world. We defined servant leadership as putting yourself at the service of others in order to guide them to God. A servant leader may not exercise power and authority, but has the capability to influence others by good example, clear vision, and sharing responsibility. We drew from Gospel examples to flesh out these three ways of leadership.

We always have the opportunity to **set a good example for others**. Any of our choices may be adopted by another person. The constant practice of virtue and prayer on our own part influences those who see it. Jesus exhorts us to follow his example when he says, "Take up your cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). He exemplifies service by washing the disciples' feet at the Last Supper (John 13). The Church exists today because the disciples followed Jesus' perfect example. Who knows what effect our own example can have?

We can guide others on their path by **communicating a vision**. Organizations develop vision statements, so people want to make choices aimed toward that goal. If people see a desirable goal to be achieved, they become motivated to make the right choices. Jesus' ultimate goal was the kingdom of God, which he described in ways which made people want to get there! He compares it to a pearl, a hidden treasure (Matthew 13) and a wedding banquet (Matthew 22). Disciples in the world can communicate an exciting vision of the Christian life.

Leaders wish to see their followers flourish and facilitate this by **sharing responsibility**. At some point, followers have to become leaders themselves, or they will never grow to full maturity. Jesus had to teach his disciples many things, but in time he gave them a mission through which they would spread the kingdom with him and realize their own purpose (Luke 10:1-12). What we call a "vocation" is God's call to *you* to participate in spreading the kingdom.
