PASTOR'S PAGE

Wheat and Weeds (Part 1)

In today's Gospel, we have the parable of the Wheat and the Weeds (Matthew 13:24-30-36-43). Wheat is used for making bread which sustains human life; weeds are literally poison to the wheat. The sower of the wheat allowed the weeds that the enemy sowed to grow alongside the wheat. As the Lord explained, the wheat is the good in the world while the weeds represent evil. We should be able to recognize good as good and evil as evil. But, sometimes, we can't recognize weeds from wheat. So, here are some examples with more to come next week:

Wheat Weeds

1. Temperance* Drunkenness

The line between these two isn't always clear especially when someone only gets "buzzed". But, the usual line from wheat to weeds is a person's tolerance. Every person of age* who drinks alcohol knows his or her tolerance or limit. If it's two drinks in a normal setting, then two drinks or less constitutes temperance which is good. After two drinks, he or she crosses over into a buzz or even drunkenness which is evil. It's wrong in itself and can lead to other evil.

2. Charity in speech Gossip

The challenge that most people have is recognizing gossip. Gossip is spreading negative word about people to others even if true. Idle gossip does nothing but tear someone down. Sometimes it's necessary to talk about others in order to solve a problem which is different. No matter if it's idle chat or problem solving, we should always strive to build others up and say "only good things" (Eph 4:29) about others behind their backs. We might have to get creative in our charity, saying simply that person X "leaves something to be desired".

3. Open to life Contraception

The general rule of thumb that we learned in seminary that I have passed on to couples is that unnatural normally means immoral. According to the Church, Natural Family Planning is the preferred wheat in living procreation / open to life while artificial contraception, IVF, and sterilizations are weeds (but can be forgiven through Confession). The distinction is not as clear with new technologies such as IUI to which the Church can be slow to respond. It is good to consult with your pastor to know if the method is wheat or weeds.
