People like to prepare me for a bit of a ghost town here in August, saying this is the month that everyone goes away. Thankfully, we did not see much of a drop off in attendance at Mass last weekend and haven't seen it all summer. Regardless of when you and your family went away, I hope that your time together was fun, restful, and uniting. Mindful that mid to late August is when most if not all people will have returned, we have two mailers coming soon to your door at home. I wanted to explain each one.

1. Sunday, September 24: Cardinal Gregory's visit and the Fall Festival

Our Archbishop will celebrate the 11 am Mass and then bless the outdoor Stations of the Cross. It's a big deal to have a Successor to the Apostles here anytime, but especially for this occasion. The Archdiocese of Washington have owned the valuable Stations for years and generously gave them to us in January free of charge. From the generosity of the sponsors of the Stations (mostly OLVP parishioners) came the path, lights, Prayer Garden, and Grotto.

We're hoping that after the Cardinal blesses our Sacred Grounds, his schedule allows him to stop by the Fall Festival for a few minutes. The festival will be on the parish grounds from 12-3 pm.
