
ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:

PASTOR'S PAGE

During the month of November, the Church prays for all of the souls in Purgatory. They cannot pray for themselves, but we can "pray them into Heaven" via indulgences. Indulgences are a generous gift to the Church from our merciful God as explained by the USCCB ("Manual of Indulgences", 2006):

Through the merits of Christ's life, death, and resurrection, the whole of his body, the Church, benefits from the redemption which he has won for all. Intimately connected with the Sacrament of Penance, indulgences are given by the Church from her spiritual treasury to remit temporal punishment for sin.

The Church is the treasurer of indulgences, and the USCCB Manual gives an extensive explanation and list of ways to gain different types of indulgences. Plenary indulgences remove all punishment for sin (time in Purgatory), thus sending a soul straight to Heaven (partial indulgences only reduce time in Purgatory).

To gain a plenary indulgence, in addition to excluding all attachment to sin, even venial sin, it is necessary to perform the indulgenced work and fulfill the following three conditions within one week: sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the (Pope).

Here are some of the ways to gain a plenary indulgence:

- * On any and each day from November 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed.
- * Visit the Blessed Sacrament for adoration lasting at least a half hour...
- * In danger of death, receiving an apostolic blessing from a priest.
- * Personally make the pious Way of the Cross (pray the Station of the Cross).
- * Devoutly recite the Marian rosary in a church or oratory, or in a family...
- * Read the Sacred Scriptures as spiritual reading, from a text approved by competent authority and with the reverence due to the divine word, for at least a half an hour.

May you know the peace of Christ.
