- 1. Leader and Co-Leader log in 10 minutes early; review parts to be read by each leader.
- 2. Welcome each participant and make note of who is on the call, let them know we will be starting at 8:00 pm.
- 3. At 8:00, **<Leader>** says:
 - Just a reminder, the protocol for the conference call is that only one person speaks at a time, or the voices don't come through clearly. So.....everyone should have their phone on "mute" as we pray.
 - I will lead the first half of the main prayers, and <co-leaders name > will lead the second half.
 - Pray at home aloud or silently, as you wish.
 - Any questions? (Optional, Pause and wait for questions)
- 4. Then, recap the names of those on the call and ask if anyone's name was missed.
- 5. **Leader>**: Start the rosary with the **Sign of the Cross**

6. Intentions

<Leader>: "As we begin to state our intentions. Make sure your phone comes off mute,, and after your intention put it back on mute. Please, end with, "We pray to the Lord"

- i. Note: <Co-leader> please, come prepared with an intention/petition.
- "<Leader> please lead us in the opening intention." Allow <co-leader> to state his or her petition and end with "We Pray to the Lord", Leader says "Lord Hear Our Prayer".
- Allow callers to state their petitions, Co-leader says "Lord hear our prayer" following each petition.
- When it seems like they are finished (10-15 seconds of silence), <Leader>: "For these and all the unspoken intentions we hold in the silence of our hearts.....We pray to the Lord". <Co-Leader>: "Lord hear our prayer". (May remind callers to check that they are on mute.)
- 7. Recite **the Apostle's Creed**, split as shown below, beginning with the **Leader**:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

- 8. **Leader—split>: Our Father**, Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy Kingdom come, Thy Will be done, On earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day, our daily bread, And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen
- 9. <Leader—split>: For an increase in the virtues of faith, hope, and charity—
 - Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen. (3x's)
- 10. **Leader—split>: Glory be to the Father**, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen
- 11. <Leader—split>: Fatima Prayer: O My Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of Hell and lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who are in most need of Thy mercy.

12. < Leader>: The First Luminous Mystery—The Baptism of Jesus

(If saying the Rosary other than on Thursday, please use the Rosary of the Day. The leader may read meditations if desired. Because Thursday is Luminious Mysteries—they are included in the remainder of this outline)

- Our Father- split recitation, always beginning with the Leader
- 10 Hail Marys- split recitation
- Glory be to the Father- split recitation
- Fatima Prayer-split recitation

13. <Leader>: The Second Luminous Mystery -The Wedding Feast at Cana

- Our Father- split recitation
- 10 Hail Marys- split recitation
- Glory be to the Father- split recitation
- Fatima Prayer- split recitation

14. <Leader>: The Third Luminous Mystery –Jesus' Proclamation of the Kingdom of God

- Our Father- split recitation
- 10 Hail Marys- split recitation
- Glory be to the Father- split recitation
- Fatima Prayer- split

15. <Leader>: The Fourth Luminous Mystery -The Transfiguration

- Our Father- split recitation
- 10 Hail Marys- split recitation
- Glory be to the Father- split recitation
- Fatima Prayer-split

16. <Leader>: The Fifth Luminous Mystery -The Institution of the Eucharist

- Our Father- split recitation
- 10 Hail Marys- split recitation
- Glory be to the Father- split recitation
- Fatima Prayer-split

17. Concluding Rosary Prayers, split recitation beginning with the Leader:

Hail, Holy Queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve.

To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears.

Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy towards us, and after this our exile, show unto us the Blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

18. The Rosary Prayer, split recitation beginning with the Leader:

"Let us pray":

O God, whose only begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal salvation.

Grant, we beseech Thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, that we may both imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Our Lady of the Visitation, pray for us. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us. Sacred Heart of Jesus, pray for us.

19. < Leader>: For the Intentions of the Holy Father, Pope Francis.

(Leader then reads the applicable monthly intention, listed below.)

JANUARY 2024

For The Gift Of Diversity In The Church

Let us pray that the Holy Spirit helps us recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community, and to discover the richness of different ritual traditions in the heart of the Catholic Church.

FEBRUARY 2024

For The Terminally III

Let us pray that the sick who are in the final stages of life, and their families, receive the necessary medical and human care and accompaniment.

MARCH 2024

For New Martyrs

Let us pray that those who risk their lives for the Gospel in various parts of the world might imbue the Church with their courage and missionary drive.

APRIL 2024

For The Role Of Women

Let us pray that the dignity and worth of women be recognized in every culture, and for an end to the discrimination they face in various parts of the world.

MAY 2024

For The Formation Of Men And Women Religious And Seminarians

Let us pray that men and women religious and seminarians, grow in their own vocational journey through human, pastoral, spiritual and community formation, that leads them to be credible witnesses of the Gospel.

JUNE 2024

For Those Fleeing Their Own Countries

Let us pray that migrants fleeing from war or hunger, forced to undertake journeys fraught with danger and violence, may find welcome and new living opportunities in their host countries.

JULY 2024

For The Pastoral Care of The Sick

Let us pray that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, bestows the Lord's strength to those who receive it and to their loved ones, and that it may become for everyone an ever more visible sign of compassion and hope.

AUGUST 2024

For Political Leaders

Let us pray that political leaders be at the service of their own people, working for integral human development and the common good, taking care of those who have lost their jobs and giving priority to the poor.

SEPTEMBER 2024

For The Cry Of The Earth

Let us pray that each of us listens with our hearts to the cry of the Earth and of the victims of environmental disasters and the climate crisis, making a personal commitment to care for the world we inhabit.

OCTOBER 2024

For A Shared Mission

Let us pray that the Church continues to sustain a synodal lifestyle in every way, as a sign of coresponsibility, promoting the participation, communion and mission shared by priests, religious and laity.

NOVEMBER 2024

For Those Who Have Lost A Child

Let us pray that all parents who mourn the loss of a son or daughter find support in their community, and may receive peace of heart from the Spirit of Consolation.

DECEMBER 2024

For Pilgrims Of Hope

Let us pray that the coming Church Jubilee Year 2025 strengthens us in our faith; helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in the midst of our lives, transforming us into pilgrims of Christian hope.

(Split recitation of the following three prayers, beginning with the leader.)

- Our Father- split recitation
- 1 Hail Mary-split recitation
- Glory Be- split recitation
- 20. Memorare, split recitation beginning with the <Leader>:

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins my Mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy, Hear and answer me. Amen.

21. **St Michael's Prayer**, split recitation beginning with the <Leader>:

St Michael the Archangel,
defend us in battle, be our protection against the
wickedness and snares of the Devil.
May God rebuke him, we humbly pray,
and do thou,
O Prince of the heavenly hosts,
by the divine power of God,
cast into hell Satan,
and all the evil spirits,
who prowl about the world
seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

- 22. **<Leader>:** In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- 23. <Leader and Co-Leader>: Farewell- thank you for joining us this evening!
