Each week, we gather as a family of faith to celebrate the Eucharist, hoping to strengthen the faith we share. Yet, it's common to feel that our faith is weak, especially when we compare ourselves to others. In this, we are in good company—even the twelve apostles felt this way. Today, we hear them ask Jesus directly, "Increase our faith." His response offers heartening wisdom for us, his present-day disciples, in our own struggles.

We see a similar cry for help in the first reading. The prophet Habakkuk shouts to God in frustration over the violence and injustice he sees, demanding action. God's answer is a call to trust and patience. When the apostles express their insecurity, Jesus doesn't scold them for a lack of faith. Instead, he assures them that even the smallest, most humble faith is powerful beyond measure.

This brings us to the challenging parable of the servant. At first glance, it seems to present a heartless dynamic: a master who demands more from a tired servant without a word of thanks. It leaves us asking, are we merely "unprofitable servants" (Luke 17:10), obligated to obey God without expecting gratitude?

To understand this, we should look at the word "profit" differently. Jesus once asked, "What profit is there for one to gain the whole world yet lose or forfeit himself?" (Luke 9:25). The "profit" we should avoid is that of worldly accomplishment and self-importance. In that sense, being an "unprofitable servant" means putting aside the desire for external reward. When we strip away the negative connotations of servanthood, we find our true calling: to serve God not out of obligation, but as the natural fulfillment of our baptismal promise. The service we offer is not a burden, but the very expression of a living faith.

Therefore, let us not be too timid to cry out to God in our need. Let us listen for His reassuring voice, and, as we sing in the psalm, may we harden not our hearts.

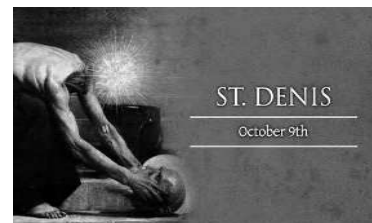


Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary October 7th

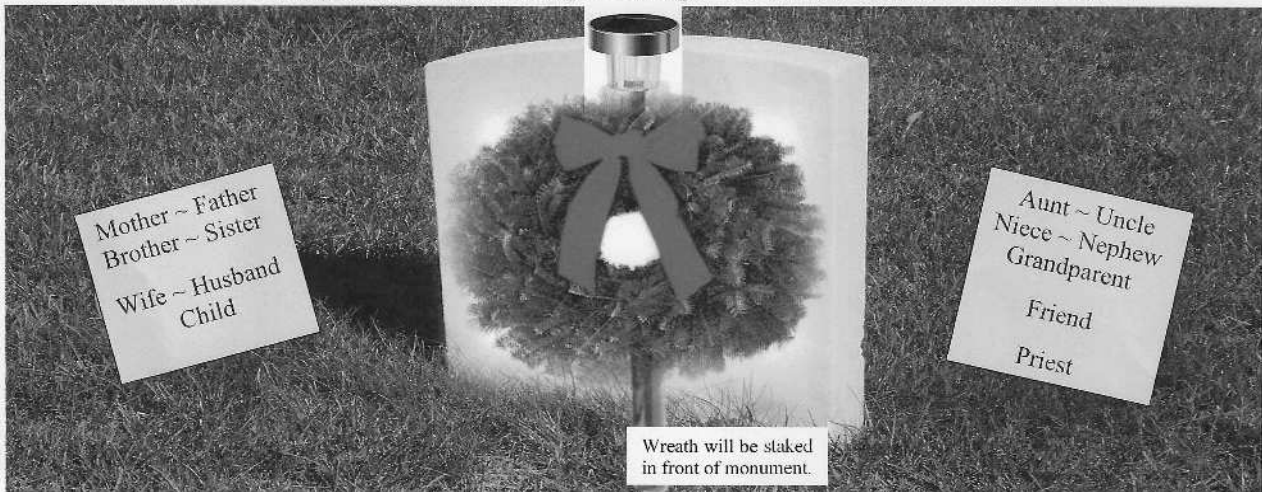

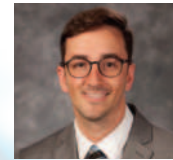
