The Way Forward

A Pastoral Letter to the Faithful of the Parish of the Precious Blood and St. Peter Chanel Parish

Dear Faithful,

As I write to you, I recall the faith of your pastors. Your pastors are seeking to do their best to care for you pastorally. The terrain is vast. Having traveled to the County for various occasions, I quickly noticed how large the Parish of the Precious Blood is—both geographically and logistically. Stretching roughly seventy miles long and thirty miles wide, and consisting of ten church buildings, it is one of the largest parishes in our diocese. The current configuration of the Parish of the Precious Blood has been in place since 2009. For twenty-six years, members of these ten churches have identified as one parish family. Therefore, I understand the apprehension and anxiety about the changes now taking place.

A New Parish Configuration

As you have heard, your pastors are leading the Parish of the Precious Blood through a transition to become two distinct parishes: - A parish in the northern part of the cluster, with its pastoral office and resident priest in Caribou. A parish in the southern part of the cluster, with its pastoral office and resident priest in Presque Isle. Another part of the proposed change involves Sacred Heart Church in Northern Caribou and St. Louis Church in Limestone becoming part of St. Peter Chanel Parish, which formerly belonged to Cluster 2, along with Our Lady of the Valley and Notre Dame du Mont Carmel. Yes, there is much happening. At present, the priests are living in their respective rectories while providing pastoral care for their assigned territories: Father Tony is pastorally caring for St. Peter Chanel Parish and its two newly added churches, Father Thomas is caring for the northern part of the Parish of the Precious Blood, - Father Sahaya is caring for the southern part of the parish. I admire these priests. I admire their faith, their fortitude, and their willingness to lead during a time of significant change. It is never easy to guide communities through transitions that may feel unsettling.

Why Change Is Necessary

One of the early benefits I’ve heard from this new configuration is that parishioners are happy to see the same priest celebrating Mass with them each week. As a priest, I can attest that regular interaction with parishioners deepens pastoral care. When we celebrate the Eucharist with the same community consistently, it strengthens relationships and builds trust. This consistency is one of the principal reasons for the reconfiguration: to provide you with more stable and consistent pastoral care. And that, I am pleased to say, is already happening.

Adjusting to the New Mass Schedule

I know that one of the most challenging parts of this transition has been the adjustment to Mass times. For many, this may be the hardest change of all. Consistency provides stability, and stability grounds us in a world that often feels in flux.

I have asked your priests to celebrate only four weekend Masses—whether that means two Saturday vigils and two Sunday morning Masses, or one on Saturday and three on Sunday. This ensures that the schedule does not depend on the regular assistance of our senior priests.

Our senior priests are a gift to the Church in the County. Their wisdom, dedication, and continued service are invaluable. However, as men who have retired from administrative and regular assignments, they should be free to assist as they are able, not obligated to a fixed schedule. Out of respect for them and their state of life, this flexibility is both pastoral and necessary.

Therefore, to those struggling with the new Mass times, I gently ask that you allow time for the schedule to settle. What may seem disruptive now may, in time, become more desirable and spiritually fruitful.

Your Role in This Transition

As we move forward, dear brothers and sisters, your active cooperation and prayerful openness are essential. Your priests need your support. As you come to know them better through more consistent contact, I am confident you will see in them what I have seen: hardworking shepherds who deeply care for the people of God entrusted to them.

Please also consider volunteering as new needs arise. The vitality of a parish depends on the collaboration of clergy and laity alike.

Responding with Vulnerability, Not Complaint

Change is never easy. It often unsettles us because we lose what feels familiar and secure. If you are struggling with these changes, please speak with your pastor. When you do talk with him, I ask you to do so in a spirit of vulnerability rather than complaint.

It is one thing to say, “Father, the old way was better. Why do we have to change it?”
It is quite another to say, “Father, these changes are difficult for me because they make me feel unsettled.”

The second response reveals your heart. It invites compassion, dialogue, and accompaniment. The first response, however, often hides deeper feelings of anxiety or loss. Authentic sharing allows us to be seen and heard, and that is something every person needs.

Your pastor’s role is not to fix every difficulty or to make all things comfortable, but to walk with you through this time of change. Faith gives us the strength to persevere together toward the goal: that your priests may serve you with renewed energy, passion, and consistency.

Faith, Hope, and Unity in the Way Forward

This path of change has begun, and it will require patience, trust, and faith. Please know that although I may not be physically present to you, I am with you spiritually. I am deeply concerned for your spiritual and personal well-being.

I have great trust in the priests I have assigned to serve you, and I extend my pastoral heart to you through them. May we all walk forward together in hope, confident that the Holy Spirit is guiding us toward greater unity and vitality in Christ.

Please know of my prayers for each of you and my ongoing concern for your families and communities.
