World Day of the Poor 2025

In his Apostolic Letter, *Misericordia et Misera* (20 November 2016), Pope Francis designated the Thirty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time as The World Day of the Poor. He wrote: “It will be a day that will help communities and each baptized person to reflect on how poverty is at the heart of the Gospel and on the fact that, as long as Lazarus lies at the door of our homes there can be no justice or social peace. This day will represent a genuine form of new evangelization which can renew the face of the Church as she perseveres in her perennial activity of pastoral conversion and witness to mercy” (21)

This Sunday, we celebrate the World Day of the Poor, a moment to pause, reflect, and recommit ourselves to the Gospel call to love and serve those in need. Inspired by the vision of Pope Leo XIV—who reminds us that the poor are central to the life of the Church—we are invited to see the world through the eyes of compassion and justice. Pope Leo XIV’s message this year draws us into the heart of Psalm 71: “You are my hope.” These words, spoken from a place of suffering, remind us that *hope is not a luxury—it is a lifeline*. And for many of our brothers and sisters living in poverty, hope is the only thing they have left.

The Psalmist speaks from a place of hardship: “You have made me see many troubles and calamities.” Yet even in this darkness, he clings to God as his refuge and fortress. This is the paradox of Christian hope—it flourishes not in abundance, but in adversity. *The poor are not objects of pity; they are witnesses to a resilient hope that refuses to die.*

Pope Leo reminds us that helping the poor is not merely an act of charity—it is a matter of justice. In this Jubilee Year, the Pope calls us to offer “new signs of hope.” What does that look like in our lives? It might mean advocating for fair wages, supporting local shelters, or simply listening to someone who feels invisible. *Hope becomes real when we embody it—when our hands, our voices, and our hearts become instruments of God’s mercy.*

Let us not forget: Jesus himself identified with the poor. He was born in a stable, lived without a home, and died between two criminals. To serve the poor is to encounter Christ. And in that encounter, we are transformed. So today, let us recommit ourselves—not just to giving, but to walking alongside. Let us be anchors of hope in a world that often feels adrift. And let us remember that in the eyes of God, no one is forgotten, no one is disposable, and no one is beyond redemption.

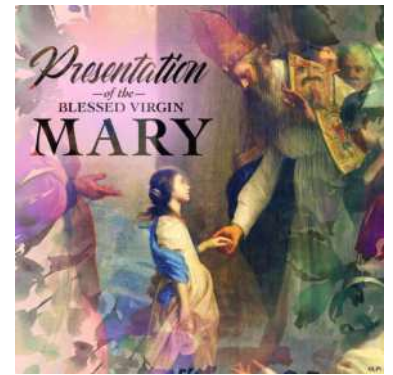

NOVEMBER IS DEDICATED TO THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

St. Gertrude's Prayer is a petition said on behalf of the Holy Souls of Purgatory, offering the Blood of Christ in reparation for the sins of the departed.

St. Gertrude, often called "St. Gertrude the Great," was a Benedictine nun who lived in 13th-century Saxony, present-day Germany. A mystic, she received visions of Christ beginning at the age of 25. She was also a prolific writer and devotee of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and is often invoked as an intercessor for the Holy Souls of Purgatory. Her feast day is celebrated on November 16.

The St. Gertrude Prayer reads: **"Eternal Father, I offer You the most precious blood of thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal Church, for those in my own home, and in my family. Amen."**

Solemnity of Christ the King - November 23rd

This feast day marks the end of the liturgical year and is a significant observance in the Catholic Church, emphasizing Christ's reign and the role of His kingdom in the world.

Traditionally it is a time to give thanks for all the sacrifice and hard work done for the harvest.

First Day of Advent - November 29th

The beginning of the Advent season—a time of spiritual preparation for Christmas as we reflect in and joyful anticipation of Christ's birth.

Preparing for Advent

Christians have always utilized candles to illustrate the metaphor of Christ as the "great light" shining on a people waiting in darkness (Isaiah 9:2). Historians tell us that pre-Christian societies in Europe also viewed candles as symbolic of the coming light of spring, and may have used wreaths of natural material along with these candles. Today, Advent Wreaths are a practice embraced by most Christians in the Western world.

An Advent Wreath consists of a circle of evergreen and four candles, one for each week of Advent. Three of the candles are purple; one is rose, representing Gaudete Sunday, a time of rejoicing at the closeness of Christmas. In Catholicism, Advent Wreaths are blessed on the First Sunday of Advent. For Advent Wreaths in private homes, it is appropriate for a family member to perform the blessing.

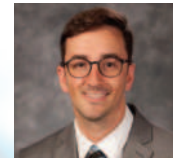
