Make a Difference in Someone's Life -

Just a Seemingly Little Can Mean a lot

When reading this weekend's Gospel passage from Mark the theme of service called out to me. This theme is most boldly presented in the optional "longer version" of this week's Gospel reading. I'm reminded of a familiar tale that is probably known to many of you. The original story below is credited to Loren Eisley:

One day a man was walking along the beach when he noticed a boy picking something up and gently throwing it into the ocean.

Approaching the boy, he asked, "What are you doing?"

The youth replied, "Throwing starfish back into the ocean. The surf is up and the tide is going out. If I don't throw them back, they'll die." "Son," the man said, "don't you realize there are miles and miles of beach and hundreds of starfish? You can't make a difference!" After listening politely, the boy bent down, picked up another starfish, and threw it back into the surf.

Then, smiling at the man, he said....."I made a difference for that one."

For all of the blessings in our lives, may we be truly grateful; and in that gratitude, may we reach out to others in love.

A friend of mine recently said to me, "Loneliness is such a horrible condition - and so curable!" Like the starfish who needs the proper environment to survive, so too, all of us need to be surrounded with love and caring, respect and support, a listening ear and an open heart. Maybe take a look this week at your "beach" - your places of encounter with others - and see whose life you can make a difference in. And like the boy walking along the beach, be gentle.

The Nobel Prize winning Irish poet William Butler Yeats often receives credit for the following sentiment: "There are no strangers here; only friends you haven't yet met".

If you are in need of a new friend you haven't yet met, or if you are feeling called to be a friend for another, please let me know and I will do my best to partner you up. We are called to serve - to be Christ's hands, feet, ears, eyes and heart here on earth. Sometimes we think that what we have to offer is just a drop in the ocean; but what is the ocean but countless drops?

Almost all of us have at least a few drops to spare and your few drops can make an enormous difference in someone else's life - and perhaps unexpectedly - an even bigger difference in your own.

PROOF OF VACCINATIONS REQUIREMENTS IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO - CHURCH BUILDINGS

Do People 12 Years of Age & Over Need to Show ID & Proof of Double Vaccination when Coming to Mass, Funerals or Weddings in the Church?

No, proof of double vaccination is not required when attending Mass or other worship services IN THE CHURCH. However, if persons 12 years of age or older are seated in overflow space in the parish hall (at churches that offer this for weekend Mass) you will be required by law to show proof of double vaccination and identification when entering the hall. Persons who cannot receive the vaccine due to medical exemptions will be permitted entry into the overflow space with a doctor's note and identification. All people attending weekend Mass at churches that utilize overflow seating (St. Benedict & St. Joseph Churches) may wish to bring their documentation with them each time in case you are seated in the overflow area - or alternatively, arrive early to be certain of available space in the church.

Weekend Masses Reaching Capacity

Some of the English Masses in our Family of Parishes are exceeding capacity (OLM 4pm, SB 9am, SH 9am, SH 11am). Please plan to arrive early - <u>particularly families requiring</u> a full pew. If the Mass you planned to attend has reached capacity, please see the poster on the door listing the times and locations of other Masses in our Family.

How About Other Gatherings Outside of Mass or Worship Services? Is Proof of Double Vaccination Required?

Yes, please note, everyone 12 years of age and over is now required by law to show proof of double vaccination in ALL areas of the church building (with the current exemption of the office area) for events other than Mass or Worship Services. Please bring your identification (showing your date of birth and name) and proof of double vaccination when coming for non-worship meetings or gatherings on church premises (for example, CWL meetings, Bible Studies). If you have a medical exemption from receiving the vaccine, please bring your identification (showing your date of birth and name) and doctor's note with you when attending such events. Thank you for your understanding.

Launching Synod 2023 in The Diocese of London

Pope Francis has announced that the XVI Ordinary Assembly of the Synod of Bishops will take place in October 2023, entitled "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission."

He inaugurated the multiphase process of the Synod at Mass in Rome on 9 and 10 October 2021.

Dioceses around the world will be launching our local efforts on Sunday, 17 October. Bishop Fabbro will celebrate an opening Mass at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, 17 October at St. Peter's Cathedral Basilica.

I invite you to extend the invitation to your faithful to join him virtually and in union with the Holy Father, to pray in your parishes that the upcoming Synod may help us discern God's will and boldly carry it out.

The Synod is very important in the life of the universal Church. During this initial preparatory phase, there will be a broad consultation of the laity, religious communities, and clergy on their experience of the Church and its mission. More information on the synodal process in the Diocese of London will be forthcoming.

As the Synod begins, we pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance as the Church embarks on an intentional process of mutual listening and engaging the People of God in a journey of communion, participation, and mission.


