1st SUNDAY of ADVENT

REFLECTION ~ Deacon David Robertson

Take special note this weekend that the Gospel reads a little different as we start this new liturgical year, Year C, or the Year of Luke. And Luke's story of Jesus includes the whole Christmas story and is certainly hopeful for those who like to "Keep Christ in Christmas".

Yes, the Gospel story of Luke delivers a Salvation story that embraces Hope, Faith, Joy and Peace. And we will experience these virtues more and more each Sunday in Advent and as we journey through this liturgical year.

For Luke's salvation story is full of faith and hopeful thinking. It is all about the belief that God's plan for us is so much better than any plan of our own. It recognizes faith and the joy in that we have been blessed with a God who will lead us toward eternal life. And of course, it is all about peace on earth and good will to every one of us!

Advent is certainly a time to internalize the glory of God!

"Gloria in excelsis Deo!"

Tempered with the wisdom that the world has always been full of political, religious, social and personal structures the Gospel of Luke situates the word of God as proclaimed to John the Baptist: "In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the regions, and during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas."

Quite a challenging group of rulers in those days challenging the efforts of those that simply wanted to "Prepare the way of the Lord".

Perhaps similar to the ongoing challenges and problems we experience in the world today. But as Christians we must stand steadfast, now and forever, in Hope, Faith, Joy and Peace.

So, embrace your Christmas preparations early by simply beginning your advent wreath as a real symbol of a Christian life without ending. Bring out those candle lights that will fortify you with a contrite heart through the advent purple of daily struggles that we all experience.

For sure this week, reflect on the first candle or “Prophecy candle” in hopeful expectation of Jesus and the coming of a savior.

So that in the second week of Advent we can light another purple candle, the “Bethlehem candle”. A reminder of our Christian faith that began with the Bethlehem journey of Joseph and Mary.

BISHOP FABBRO EXTENDS MASS DISPENSATION

The dispensation from the Sunday obligation is now extended to the last Sunday of Winter Ordinary Time, that is up to and including 27 February 2022.

The month of March may see further lessening of restrictions, at which time this decision will be reviewed.

CONGREGATIONAL SINGING HAS RETURNED!

In light of the higher number of people who are vaccinated across the province, the Worship Safe Working Committee reviewed safety protocols regarding singing. Singing is now allowed during our liturgies.

Masks that cover nose, mouth and chin must be worn and remain in place for congregational singing.

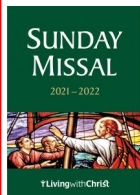

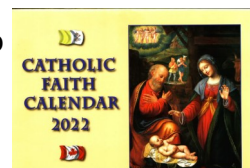
Catholic Faith Calendar

IRISH MIRACLE

The Irish Miracle 2021 Organizing Committee is back in action with another unordinary year where the need is, once again, unprecedented. Traditionally, every year, St. Patrick's students, teachers and community volunteers come together to collect non-perishable food goods for the St. Vincent de Paul. The collection has two purposes: One is to stock the shelves at the food bank for the next few months and the other is to provide food for the Christmas hampers distributed directly to families with the help of the area parishes.

After much consideration, St. Pat's, together with the St. Vincent de Paul, have decided that for this year we will be using two collection methods to meet the needs of those who are most vulnerable in our community and need our support during the holidays.

We will be hosting a Non-Perishable Food Drive Drop Off on **December 4, 2021 at St. Patrick's High School** (1001 The Rapids Parkway). Community members are invited to a drive-thru style donation drive of their nonperishable food items from **9:00am-12:00pm** on that day.
