REFLECTION ~ Rev. Jose Montepeque

In the Gospel, Jesus says that we are to make choices based on God's standard. God doesn't just forgive us one time. God forgives us over and over again. God doesn't show love to us just one time; God shows love all the time. Therefore, Jesus teaches us, "I say to you that listen: love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." And last week, Jesus said, "Blessed are you who are poor..., blessed are you who are hungry...; Blessed are you who weep...; Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you.." What? Seriously? But, this is not what the world nowadays encourages! Yes, exactly! These are teachings of "reversals" from what the world teaches and promotes. Yes, Jesus' teaching is controversial against the social and moral behavioral norms of today's world. They are countercultural! And this is what separates Christianity from any other religion: Grace, God's grace. The world might teach "revenge", "get even," "pay back" but Christians are called to treat others, not as they deserve, but as God wishes them to be treated -with loving kindness and mercy. The power of Jesus Christ's redeeming love and mercy comes from his cross, which free us from the oppression and hatred of sin and death. Therefore, we can endure hate, curse, abuse, exclusion, persecution, grief, and hatred, by invoking Jesus' name! because "when I am weak, then I am strong" (Paul 2Cor.12:10) God's power is stronger in our weakness, and everything is "on account of the Son of Man" In Luke, Jesus contrasts the behavior of his followers with the behavior of "sinners." It begins by saying, "love your enemies" and concludes by "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful" Luke concludes by emphasizing God's mercy. Jesus' words challenge us who would follow him to be more like God. God loves us beyond our expectations, beyond anything we can possibly imagine. In response to God's love, we are to love as God loves, beyond expectations and with a depth beyond imagining, even our enemies!

REFLEXION DE PÈRE JOSE:

Dans l'Évangile, Jésus dit que nous devons faire des choix basés sur la norme de Dieu. Dieu ne nous pardonne pas une seule fois. Dieu nous pardonne encore et encore. Dieu ne nous montre pas d'amour une seule fois ; Dieu montre de l'amour tout le temps. C'est pourquoi Jésus nous enseigne : «Je vous dis à vous qui écoutez: aimez vos ennemis, faites du bien à ceux qui vous haïssent, bénissez ceux qui vous maudissent, priez pour ceux qui abusent de vous.» Et la semaine dernière, Jésus a dit: « Heureux ceux qui sont pauvres... bénis ceux qui ont faim...; heureux vous qui pleurez...; heureux êtes-vous quand les gens vous haïssent, et quand ils vous excluent et vous insultent». Quoi? Sérieusement? Mais, ce n'est pas ce que le monde d'aujourd'hui encourage! Exactement! Ce sont des enseignements de «renversements» par rapport à ce que le monde enseigne et promeut. Oui, l'enseignement de Jésus est controversé contre les normes comportementales sociales et morales du monde d'aujourd'hui. Ils sont contre-culturels! Et c'est ce qui sépare le christianisme de toute autre religion: la grâce, la grâce de Dieu. Le monde peut enseigner la «vengeance», «se venger», «rembourser», mais les chrétiens sont appelés à traiter les autres, non pas comme ils le méritent, mais comme Dieu souhaite qu'ils soient traités avec bonté et miséricorde. La puissance de l'amour rédempteur et de la miséricorde de Jésus Christ vient de sa croix, qui nous libère de l'oppression et de la haine du péché et de la mort. Par conséquent, nous pouvons endurer la haine, la malédiction, l'abus, l'exclusion, la persécution, le chagrin et la haine, en invoquant le nom de Jésus! parce que «quand je suis faible, alors je suis fort» (Paul 2Cor.12:10) La puissance de Dieu est plus forte dans notre faiblesse, et tout est «à cause du Fils de l'homme» Dans Luc, Jésus oppose le comportement de ses disciples au comportement des «pécheurs». Il commence par dire : «Aimez vos ennemis» et se termine par «Soyez miséricordieux, tout comme votre Père est miséricordieux», Conclut Luc en soulignant la miséricorde de Dieu. Les paroles de Jésus nous mettent au défi, nous qui le suivrions, d'être plus semblables à Dieu. Dieu nous aime au-delà de nos attentes, au-delà de tout ce que nous pouvons imaginer. En réponse à l'amour de Dieu, nous devons aimer comme Dieu aime, audelà des attentes et avec une profondeur au-delà de l'imagination, même de nos ennemis!

REFLECCION DEL PADRE JOSE:

En el Evangelio, Jesús dice que debemos tomar decisiones basadas en el estándar de Dios. Dios no solo nos perdona una vez. Dios nos perdona una y otra vez. Dios no nos muestra amor una sola vez; Dios muestra amor todo el tiempo. Por lo tanto, Jesús nos enseña: "Os digo que escuchéis: amad a vuestros enemigos, haced el bien a los que os odian, bendecid a los que os maldicen, orad por los que abusan de vosotros". Y la semana pasada, Jesús dijo: "Bienaventurados los que sois pobres..., bienaventurados los que tenéis hambre...: Bienaventurados los que lloráis...: Bendito eres cuando la gente te odia, y cuando te excluyen, te injurian". ¿Qué? ¿Seriamente? Pero, ¡esto no es lo que el mundo hoy en día fomenta! ¡Sí, exactamente! Estas son enseñanzas de "reversiones" de lo que el mundo enseña y promueve. Sí, la enseñanza de Jesús es controvertida contra las normas de comportamiento social y moral del mundo de hoy. ¡Son contraculturales! Y esto es lo que separa al cristianismo de cualquier otra religión: la gracia, la gracia de Dios. El mundo puede enseñar "venganza", "desquitarse", "pagar", pero los cristianos están llamados a tratar a los demás, no como se merecen, sino como Dios desea que sean tratados, con bondad amorosa y misericordia. El poder del amor y la misericordia redentores de Jesucristo proviene de su cruz, que nos libera de la opresión y el odio del pecado y la muerte. Por lo tanto, podemos soportar el odio, la maldición, el abuso, la exclusión, la persecución, el dolor y el odio, ¡invocando el nombre de Jesús! porque "cuando soy débil, entonces soy fuerte" (Pablo 2 Corintios 12:10) El poder de Dios es más fuerte en nuestra debilidad, y todo es "a causa del Hijo del Hombre" En Lucas, Jesús contrasta el comportamiento de sus seguidores con el comportamiento de los "pecadores". Comienza diciendo: "ama a tus enemigos" y concluye por "Sé misericordioso, así como tu Padre es misericordioso". Lucas concluye enfatizando la misericordia de Dios. Las palabras de Jesús nos desafían a quienes lo seguirían a ser más como Dios. Dios nos ama más allá de nuestras expectativas, más allá de cualquier cosa que podamos imaginar. En respuesta al amor de Dios, debemos amar como Dios ama, más allá de las expectativas y con una profundidad más allá de la imaginación, ¡incluso a nuestros enemigos!
