SUNDAY, June 5, 2022 The Feast of Pentacost

REFLECTION ~ Deacon David Kraemer

Happy Birthday! Today we mark the birth of the Church on earth, with the descending of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. In last week's Feast of the Ascension first reading (Acts 1:1-11), Jesus tells his disciples to stay in Jerusalem for the promise of the Father. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you will be my witnesses ... to the ends of the earth."

And so it was that many pilgrims were there in Jerusalem at that time, celebrating their own Pentecost, or specifically the Feast of Shavuot. This feast (also known as the Feast of Weeks) was celebrated 50 days after Passover to celebrate the wheat harvest in the Land of Israel (Exodus 34:22). But more importantly, it marked the revelation of the Torah to Moses and the Israelites at Mount Sinai. On Passover, the people of Israel were freed from their enslavement to Pharaoh; on Shavuot, they were given the Torah and became a nation committed to serving God. These pilgrims represented the far reaches of the known world at that time, the 'ends of the earth' so to speak.

Thus it was so appropriate that Jesus, who frequently described himself as the fulfilment of the Hebrew Law, the Torah, should initiate the New Life in the Spirit, the new chosen people, the New Testament Church by sending the Holy Spirit upon his followers. It was the power of the Spirit that opened their minds and hearts to the scriptures and all that Jesus had taught them. It was the power of the Spirit that caused the mighty wind to attract the attention of those in Jerusalem. It was the power of the Spirit that gave the apostles the courage to leave the secret room where they were hiding behind locked doors and proclaim the truth of God's salvation.

When the apostles spoke to the people of Jerusalem and they all heard it in their own native language, was the manifestation of the Holy Spirit in the words the apostles spoke or was it in the ears of those who heard it? Perhaps both.

Was the audience awe-struck by the power of the Spirit that manifested itself in the wind and sounds but also the joyful and courageous exuberance of the newly empowered apostles? How the Holy Spirit works is yet another divine mystery that we can only marvel at.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, knowledge, understanding, fortitude, counsel, piety and awe of the Lord) help us, imperfect people that we are, to carry thru with our mission of being Christ's witnesses and bringing God's love to the ends of the earth. When we call on the Holy Spirit, these gifts give us the power to understand scripture and the teachings of Jesus and they give us the courage to step out from behind our own locked doors. The fruits of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control) are thus evidenced to the world around us by our sharing of these gifts. The unique talents or Charisms that we receive from God are to be fitted together with the charisms of our fellow believers, like a jigsaw puzzle, to bring the picture of God to our world. The picture of God's plan is incomplete if my piece is missing.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

Come, Holy Spirit.

Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of your love.

Send forth your Sprit and they shall be created and

you shall renew the face of the earth.

O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit,

did instruct the hearts of your faithful.

Grant that by that same Holy Spirit,

we may be truly wise and ever enjoy his consolation.

Through Christ our Lord,

Amen.

COVID-19 Update from Bishop Fabbro

During the most recent meeting of the Episcopal Council, I reviewed with the Episcopal Vicars and Vicars General all of the protocols that are still in place with respect to our churches, halls and offices.

As of Monday, 6 June 2022, I hereby abrogate all the restrictions and expectations as found in all previous **COVID-related directives...**

1. Some Precautions for the General Public

Though the worst of COVID -19 seems to have passed, we are aware that there are still variants which arise from time to time and that there is still danger of the spread of the virus. Therefore, all are encouraged to continue to wear masks in public spaces such as churches and halls. In offices, sensitivity to those who may be immuno-compromised should be shown by a willingness to wear masks also in the public spaces of our offices.

It is prudent, as well, to continue to make hand sanitizer available in all of our buildings.

If a member of your staff, parish team, volunteer or a parishioner has symptoms of

COVID-19 or has been exposed to someone with COVID-19, follow the directions, such as those given for isolation, on the website of your local health unit. There is no longer a need to report positive cases to the Diocesan Centre.

2. Dispensation from the Sunday Obligation Extended

The celebration of the Eucharist and other sacraments is central to our Catholic faith. Not only do we need to pray and hear the word of God together, but our participation in Holy Communion is the essential "food for our journey" as disciples of Jesus. For this reason, we need to encourage the faithful to return to the celebration of Mass, providing a warm welcome, good homilies and good music - really, good liturgies in general - the three points I have often highlighted when I have spoken with various groups.

Our Pastoral Services team is working with people across the Diocese to develop the "Nurturing Joy Initiative". The idea is to have a diocesan-wide approach to welcoming all those who have continued to come to Mass during the pandemic and to encourage those who until now have been concerned about returning. In later stages of "Nurturing Joy", we want to extend such a welcome to the "de-churched" (those who for any number of reasons have stopped coming to Mass and the sacraments) and the "un-churched" (those who have no affiliation with any Church or ecclesial community). This is a vital part of the work of evangelization and the raison d'être of the Church, to bring people to Jesus and to form them as disciples.

We realize, however, that many are still cautious and concerned about being in crowds, since COVID is still with us. As such, we want to be sensitive to their needs and to serve them in the best way possible. Therefore, the dispensation from the Sunday obligation is now extended to the last weekend of the summer vacation period, that is, until 6 September 2022. Unless a serious danger presents itself again at some future date, this will be the last extension. The removal of the dispensation will be confirmed before Labour Day.

Pourquoi nous comparons-nous aux autres? Pas surprenant alors que nous avons beaucoup de rivaux. Nous essavons toujours de dépasser nos voisins! Bien que Pierre et Jean aient été appelés à devenir disciples de Jésus, chacun a reçu une fonction ou une tâche différente et n'ont pas été en rivalité. Après la résurrection, nous voyons Pierre qui demande au sujet de Jean, Seigneur, et lui? et Jésus lui répond, Que t'importe? Toi, suis-moi. Le Christ confie à Pierre la tâche de « Paître ses brebis. » et finalement il va être mis à mort à cause de sa fidélité au Christ. Quant à Jean, il va vivre une très longue vie pendant laquelle il sera lui aussi témoin du Christ et de sa Résurrection et au cours de laquelle il va écrire son Évangile. Comme chrétiens, nous sommes appelés à être des pacificateurs ou des artisans de paix. REFLECCION DEL PADRE JOSE:

Tú, sígueme » Cristo confía a Pedro la tarea de "Alimentar a sus ovejas" y finalmente será ejecutado por su fidelidad a Cristo. En cuanto a Juan, vivirá una vida muy larga durante la cual él también será testigo de Cristo y de su Resurrección y durante la cual escribirá su Evangelio.
