Reflection ~ Fr. Rob Renaud

This Sunday the priests and deacons dust off their rose vestments as we celebrate Laetare Sunday. Laetare means an outward showing of joy, we rejoice knowing that Jesus conquered sin and death on the cross, whereas Gaudete refers to an inward joy that we experience during Advent. Someone once asked me why I look so happy celebrating the Mass. It's definitely a joyful moment for me, realizing my call as a priest to bring Jesus to all of you in the Eucharist. Before I was a priest, though, I taught life skills as a counsellor. In cases where people are sad and disheartened, the simple act of making yourself smile releases chemicals that make you happy. It's also contagious, making others happy too! Throughout Lent we have been reflecting solemnly on the cross, and the death of our Lord. Today, however, we have an outward show of joy knowing that Jesus will conquer death and lead the way to eternal life for us who follow him.


Ce dimanche, les prêtres et les diacres dépoussièrent leurs vêtements roses pour célébrer le dimanche de Laetare. Laetare signifie une manifestation extérieure de joie, nous nous réjouissons de savoir que Jésus a vaincu le péché et la mort sur la croix, tandis que Gaudete fait référence à une joie intérieure que nous expérimentons pendant l'Avent. Quelqu'un m'a demandé un jour pourquoi j'avais l'air si heureux en célébrant la messe. C'est certainement un moment de joie pour moi, car je réalise mon appel en tant que prêtre à apporter Jésus à chacun d'entre vous dans l'Eucharistie. Mais avant d'être prêtre, j'ai enseigné des techniques de vie en tant que conseiller. Lorsque les gens sont tristes et découragés, le simple fait de sourire libère des substances neurochimiques qui rendent heureux. Le sourire est également contagieux et rend les autres heureux! Tout au long du Carême, nous avons réfléchi solennellement à la croix et à la mort de notre Seigneur. Aujourd'hui, cependant, nous pouvons manifester notre joie en sachant que Jésus vaincra la mort et ouvrira la voie à la vie éternelle pour nous qui le suivons.

En los casos en los que las personas están tristes y desanimadas, el simple hecho de hacerte sonreír libera sustancias químicas que te hacen feliz. 

We welcome Father Tony Kwasi Donkor who will be with us in our Family of Parishes for the next several months as he learns about Canadian life and our Catholic Parishes.

Fr. Tony was born on June 4, 1968 in Kumasi, Ashanti, Ghana, West Africa. He is a priest of the Congregation of the Holy Spirit (Spiritans).



His primary and secondary education was in Ghana followed by three years of philosophy in Ghana and four years of theology at the University of Eastern Africa in Kenya.

These studies were followed by two years of pastoral experience in Gabon, one year to learn the French language and one year for parish work. Fr. Tony speaks English, French and Spanish.

He was ordained in the Archdiocese of Kumasi, Ahanti, Ghana on July 14, 2007. Parish work includes:

- 2011...2012, St. Paul's Parish Nyinahin Kumasi, Ghana, as an associate pastor
- 2013...2016, Sacred Heart Parish, Trede, Kumasi as a parish priest.

- 2019...2022, St. Joseph Parish, Seme Podji, Porto Novo, Benin
- 2023...2024, Spiritan Provincialate, Accra, Adenta helping at St. Raphael Parish, Pantang, Accra
- 2024, Arrived in Canada on the 9th of November, and assigned to the Sarnia Bluewater Roman Catholic Family of Parishes on the 27th February 2024.





To You Who Bring Small Children to Church ...

There you are sitting in Mass. Your child, or toddler, is restless. Perhaps they're even a little boisterous. You try to silence them, and nothing. You try to pacify them with food or toys, and nothing. Eventually, you resort to the last thing you wanted to do: you pick them up, and before a watching audience, you make the march out of the Church. All the while, you're a little embarrassed. Maybe you're a little frustrated too. You might even think to yourself, "There's no



point in coming to church. I get nothing out of it because I have to constantly care for my kid."

I want you — <u>you mothers and/or fathers</u> — to know just how encouraging you are to so many. The little elderly woman who often feels alone beams with a smile at the sight of you wrestling with your little one. She's been there before. She knows how hard it can be, but she smiles because to hear that, brings back precious memories. To see young parents and their small children brighten her day, and she may have just received bad news this week about her health, but seeing the vitality of young ones removes — if but for a moment — her fears.

The older man who always seems to be grouchy notices you too. He's always talking about how children in this day have no respect or sense of good. But, he sees you — a young family — in church, and you don't miss any gathering. Like clockwork, he can depend on the sight of you and your young family. You give him hope that maybe the church isn't doomed after all, because there are still young parents who love God enough to bring their restless children to worship.

Bring your children to church. If you don't hear crying, the church is dying. As hard as it might be for you as a parent who's half-asleep, keep on doing what you're doing. You are an encouragement, and you're starting off your children's lives as you should.
