Reflection ~ Rev. Jan Burczyk

"Faith without works is dead."

Today, so many baptized people try to claim that they are believers, even though they have rejected religious practices and sometimes even the moral principles of the Decalogue. They should then be asked where the fruits of their faith are. Faith and belonging to Christ are recognized by their fruits. This is how God Himself set it up. Faith is alive like a tree. If it is alive, it bears fruit. No one asks about the life of a tree whose branches bend under the weight of fruit. We admire the fruit, not the tree. God has such an approach to faith. He admires the fruits of faith in our hearts and does not wait for us to declare faith with our lips. The fruit of faith is obedience to God and His commandments. St. James writes to encourage Christians to live out their faith in everyday life. He tells them to be patient, to avoid judging others, and to control their tongues. He also speaks about the importance of caring for the poor and not showing favoritism to the rich. For Catholics, this letter is important because it emphasizes that faith and good works go together. His teachings are direct and easy to understand. "Faith without works is dead." This means that believing in Jesus is not enough; Christians must also live out their faith by doing good deeds.

Réflexion ~ Rev. Jan Burczyk

« La foi sans les œuvres est morte.

Aujourd'hui, tant de baptisés prétendent être croyants, alors qu'ils ont rejeté les pratiques religieuses et parfois même les principes moraux du Décalogue. Il faudrait alors leur demander où sont les fruits de leur foi. La foi et l'appartenance au Christ se reconnaissent à leurs fruits. C'est ainsi que Dieu lui-même l'a établi.

La foi est vivante comme un arbre. Si elle est vivante, elle porte des fruits. Personne ne s'interroge sur la vie d'un arbre dont les branches plient sous le poids des fruits. Nous admirons le fruit, pas l'arbre. Dieu a une telle approche de la foi. Il admire les fruits de la foi dans nos cœurs et n'attend pas que nous déclarions notre foi avec nos lèvres. Le fruit de la foi est l'obéissance à Dieu et à ses commandements. Jacques écrit pour encourager les chrétiens à vivre leur foi dans la vie de tous les jours. Il leur dit d'être patients, d'éviter de juger les autres et de contrôler leur langue. Il parle également de l'importance de prendre soin des pauvres et de ne pas faire preuve de favoritisme à l'égard des riches. Pour les catholiques, cette lettre est importante car elle souligne que la foi et les bonnes œuvres vont de pair. Ses enseignements sont directs et faciles à comprendre. « La foi sans les œuvres est morte. Cela signifie qu'il ne suffit pas de croire en Jésus ; les chrétiens doivent également vivre leur foi en accomplissant de bonnes actions.

Odbicie ~ Rev. Jan Burczyk

"Wiara bez uczynków jest martwa".

Dzisiaj tak wielu ochrzczonych ludzi próbuje twierdzić, że są wierzącymi, mimo że odrzucili praktyki religijne, a czasem nawet zasady moralne Dekalogu. Wtedy należy ich zapytać, gdzie są owoce ich wiary. Wiara i przynależność do Chrystusa są rozpoznawane po owocach. Tak to ustanowił sam Bóg.

Wiara jest żywa jak drzewo. Jeśli jest żywa, wydaje owoce. Nikt nie pyta o życie drzewa, którego gałęzie uginają się pod ciężarem owoców. Podziwiamy owoce, nie drzewo. Bóg ma takie podejście do wiary. Podziwia owoce wiary w naszych sercach i nie czeka, aż wyznamy wiarę naszymi ustami. Owocem wiary jest posłuszeństwo Bogu i Jego przykazaniom. Św. Jakub pisze, aby zachęcić chrześcijan do życia wiarą w codziennym życiu. Mówi im, aby byli cierpliwi, unikali osądzania innych i kontrolowali swój język. Mówi również o tym, jak ważne jest troszczenie się o biednych i niefaworyzowanie bogatych. Dla katolików ten list jest ważny, ponieważ podkreśla, że wiara i dobre uczynki idą w parze. Jego nauki są bezpośrednie i łatwe do zrozumienia. "Wiara bez uczynków jest martwa". Oznacza to, że wiara w Jezusa nie wystarczy; chrześcijanie muszą również żyć swoją wiarą, czyniąc dobre uczynki.

Reflexión:

"La fe sin obras está muerta".

Hoy en día, muchos bautizados tratan de afirmar que son creyentes, a pesar de que han rechazado las prácticas religiosas y, a veces, incluso los principios morales del Decálogo. Entonces se les debe preguntar dónde están los frutos de su fe. La fe y la pertenencia a Cristo se reconocen por sus frutos. Así es como Dios mismo lo estableció. La fe está viva como un árbol. Si está vivo, da fruto. Nadie pregunta por la vida de un árbol cuyas ramas se doblan bajo el peso de la fruta. Admiramos el fruto, no el árbol. Dios tiene ese enfoque de la fe. Él admira los frutos de la fe en nuestros corazones y no espera a que declaremos la fe con nuestros labios. El fruto de la fe es la obediencia a Dios y a Sus mandamientos. Santiago escribe para animar a los cristianos a vivir su fe en la vida cotidiana. Les dice que sean pacientes, que eviten juzgar a los demás y que controlen sus lenguas. También habla de la importancia de cuidar a los pobres y no mostrar favoritismo hacia los ricos. Para los católicos, esta carta es importante porque enfatiza que la fe y las buenas obras van de la mano. Sus enseñanzas son directas y fáciles de entender. "La fe sin obras está muerta". Esto significa que creer en Jesús no es suficiente; Los cristianos también deben vivir su fe haciendo buenas obras.



Someone is needed a few hours each week to assist with interviewing the Foodbank/Help Centre clientele to find out how SVDP can help. Drivers are needed to pick up donated food from stores in Sarnia, and Christmas is always a busy time for SVDP. Perhaps you could represent your parish at SVDP meetings. So there are lots of opportunities to help out without making a large time commitment. Please give it some thought and consider volunteering.

DID YOU KNOW? By Deacon Christopher Stoesser

It doesn't occur often and when it does it certainly captures our attention. Throughout next week, though, it will be glaringly present and too hard not to notice. If you were to attend mass each day next week, you will note that the priest is vested in red, again and again and again. Four times are red vestments donned, each time to recognize the memorial of a martyr(s).

The very word stirs in us a strong reaction. Yet, the essence of the word which originates from the Greek is actually understood to mean "witness". In other words, a martyr is one who 'testifies' to a truth. A martyr is one who would willingly stand before a panel and boldly vouchsafe what is true. A martyr is one who is fearless in being a messenger of the truth. Today we know that the connotation of this word is used mostly as being a witness unto death, that is, to shed one's blood, hence the red, in defense of the truth. Jesus, of course, is the prototype of such an example and we remember those faithful at next week's masses who have followed in His path.

We too, in whatever small ways, are called to be those witnesses. We too are called to make present, make known, to testify by way of whatever small sacrifices we make, in our daily lives, the love and the mercy of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. We pray for ourselves, our family of parishes and our Church as we read and contemplate Acts1: 8 - "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."




