

RENDER UNTO CAESAR A FINANCIAL COLUMN

2024 has come and gone and we now have a better idea of how well the various parishes in our Family were able to meet their financial obligations. December is usually the time when parishes start to turn a surplus. This year was no exception.

Your generous giving allowed us to close the books in a better financial situation than at the start of 2024. The December monthly offerings represented close to 15% of your yearly weekly contributions. This allowed us to post surpluses for most of our parishes and to close the deficit gap for some.



FACILITIES, FINANCIAL UPDATES

Safety/ Security

As previously reported, the Diocese of London is implementing an occupational Safety and Health Program. The goal is to protect workers from health and safety hazards on the job. The program will set out duties for all workplace parties and rights for workers to help establish a strong internal responsibility system at workplaces managed by the diocese.

To ensure the safety of staff and parishioners, considering recent events at one of our parishes, we are reviewing all our security protocols with the goal of reducing the risk of violence at the workplace. As a first step, we are restricting admission to the Family of Parishes office. Visitors will be required to buzz for access and will be admitted once identified.

We are looking at more secure ways to access and monitor our sites by adopting best practices available in industry. These changes will involve new protocols, new hardware and more importantly a new mindset of how we evaluate risks and how we will mitigate them. More to come on this file.

A question I am frequently asked is how can I rent a hall? We are not a commercial hall operator and therefore do not rent our facilities for commercial or private functions. What Are My Spiritual Gifts?

"Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire." – St. Catherine of Siena

We receive many gifts of the Holy Spirit through our Baptism and Confirmation. We are taught about the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit which are sanctifying gifts given to help us grow in our faith. We also receive charisms which are gifts that we use for the good of others. The Holy Spirit works through us in our charisms to bring God's love, mercy and healing to our family, friends, fellow parishioners and to members of the community.

Since charisms are the Holy Spirit working through us, we see results above and beyond our natural abilities. When we

use our charisms, we feel energized, a joyful satisfaction, and that we have found our place. Using your charisms is a great remedy for burn out that many of us experience in our lives.

The charisms program involves a personal inventory quiz to help identify potential charisms, videos, a "gifts" interview to begin your discernment, tools to help with discernment and small groups to share your experiences together.

All charisms are evangelizing in their own way and are given to the baptized for the sake of Christ's mission. Discerning your charisms will help you and our family of parishes as we unite to spread the news of Jesus's love and mercy to everyone we encounter.

The course is offered through the work of the Catherine of Siena Institute. Rayjon children's Nutrition Program

Despite the ongoing political instability and inflation crisis in Haiti, the programs continue to make a significant impact. The rising cost of living has exacerbated childhood malnutrition, with 48 infants currently enrolled in the nutrition program. Many families fleeing violence in Port-au-Prince have sought refuge in Cap-Haïtien, often arriving with nothing, but the clothes on their backs, and in urgent need of assistance. Marie and her daughter, nutrition program participants pictured above, are an example of this. The center has been a vital resource, providing life-saving nutrition and support to these displaced families as well as filling the needs of families native to Cap Haïtien.



Rayjon Eyeglass Program

In November 2024, 21 Rayjon volunteers went to the Christian Medical Society in Honduras to provide vision care for marginalized communities in Honduras. While there, the team served 655 patients, referred 76 patients for further ophthalmic treatment at the CCSH Clinic in El Progreso and another 7 patients will have glasses made at this clinic as Rayjon did not have a prescription match in their inventory. Even though they faced unplanned circumstances when Hurricane Sara delayed their return home, they made the best of the situation while awaiting a rescue flight home. The extended stay in Honduras due to the hurricane and some other unplanned circumstances resulted in a significant trip cost increase that was managed with helpful donations from the Petrolia Lion's Club and the Social Justice Team of the Bluewater Roman Catholic Parishes. All in all, this was an incredibly successful eyeglass trip. If you have used eyeglasses that you would like to donate to the Rayjon Eyeglass Trips, you can give them to any Rayjon member or drop them at any Family of Parish church. You can also drop them at any Optometric Office labelled for Rayjon. Thank you for your continued support for the Rayjon Eyeglass Trips.

The Social Justice & Missions Team is active throughout the year keeping parishioners informed on activities and programs which fall under the Social Justice umbrella. They include Development & Peace Campaigns, Migrant Worker Ministry activities, Truth & Reconciliation information/updates and efforts on behalf of the Homeless and Affordable Housing Team. Pikangikum Christmas Project 2024









(letter from Missionary, Colleen Estes)

Dear Friends with Big Hearts,

This year, over 350 presents were delivered to families in Pikangikum who had losses this past year. Thanks to you who shopped, wrapped, packed, transported, provided for and prayed, and to Nick Backlund (my coworker), Ajay Owen (high school student) and Aaron McGill and his family (ministering in my absence in Pikangikum) who organized and delivered them!

I would like to share what Nick wrote in his prayer update:

"My favourite memory of this time was delivering to a wonderful 11 year old girl. She saw us in the driveway and was waiting for us at the door with a big smile. The joy that radiated from the girl was

incredible because you could see the appreciation and love of Jesus in her eyes as we came bearing gifts to her home." (The girl had lost her older sister.. almost 12 years old.. to suicide in February).

"I am thankful to those who took the time and gave money and energy to buy and send presents to these families. Some people think it is a small thing and makes no impact, but I beg to differ. When you value people, and especially children, you take value in the heart of God. People in Pikangikum are feeling the love of Christ because of your partnership and God remembers these things."



While the team was trudging through the snow and up rickety steps, and I was continuing to heal from hip surgery at my friend's apartment in Rainy River, I got a call from a grandma in Pikangikum. She had lost her beloved husband to suicide in April.



"This morning, I was crying and talking to God. I told Him, 'Brian and I would have been shopping and buying Christmas presents for our grandchildren. Where am I going to get presents for my grandkids?' Just then, I heard a knock on the door and "Merry Christmas." There were your friends with presents for me and my children and my grandkids!"

In past years, I have known where it is ok to take pictures and where it isn't appropriate, and because the team were strangers to most of the people, they didn't feel comfortable taking many pictures. I appreciate their sensitivity. But they said there was lots of joy on kids' faces!

A man who lost his five year old grandson to drowning and three days later, lost his wife to illness, posted on Facebook:

"Very thoughtful of Colleen Estes and the church that sent these gifts to me and my family. I'm very thankful, grateful, and kind of overwhelmed by it."

Yup, this says it all!!! God bless you!!

Nick's Christian Ed Grades 1-4 Class

Nick wrote in his Christmas letter, "I was teaching about how God created us in His image and how God took His time and passionately formed us with many different talents and personalities. One little girl came up to me one day and asked me "Is God really real?" I said "He sure is and He loves you greatly." She responded, "Yeah, I like that...I believe you!" I walked away from that and thought about it for the past couple weeks. How we make faith complicated. We tell ourselves we need to do this and get to this point to be faithful. But the heart of a child is a heart close to God which speaks, "Yeah, you are so real. Yeah, I can believe in that." Simple faith with a wonderful love of the Father. That girl taught me something. That I can still have that same simple faith. "Yeah, you are real and you love me." I can respond with those same words "Yeah...I like that!" My prayer after thinking about it is this...Lord, let me never lose that precious wonder of knowing you."



The information provided in articles written for 2024 Family of Parishes monthly newsletters brings us to a time where we will explore some aspects of local Indigenous peoples. The information was taken from a guide developed through collaboration with local Indigenous Knowledge Keepers, with the goal of helping those in the community form a better understanding and connection with each other. Regional and Cultural differences

There are 4 distinct First Nation communities within Sarnia/Lambton/Chatham-Kent. They are Aamjiwnaang First Nation, Kettle and Stony Point First Nation and Bkejwanong First Nation, which are members of the Three Fires Confederacy. The fourth is the Lenape Nation at Moraviantown. Each community is a part of a distinct nation that has a unique culture, tradition, belief, history, political affiliation, experience and perspective. There are also many different people from other bands dispersed among the four communities.

- 1. Wiiwkwedong (Kettle Point) and Aazhoodenaang (Stony Point) located on Lake Huron in Bosanquet Township and members of the Anishinaabeg Nation.
- 2. Aamjiwnaang First Nation located on the St. Clair River, in the city limits of Sarnia.
- 3. Bkejwanong First Nation (Walpole Island) unceded territory located near Wallaceburg, at the mouth of the St. Clair River is comprised of six islands that are occupied by the Ojibwe, Potawatomi and Odawa people.
- 4. Delaware Nation at Moraviantown located on the southern shores of the Thames River, near Thamesville Home of the Lenape People of the Delaware Nation, called the grandfather nation by the other Anishinaabeg nations because they are the original people from the Atlantic seaboard.

Fiddle and Sash Metis Community – located in Lambton/Kent counties. They are not affiliated with any political Metis group and were formed as a strictly social group in order to celebrate Metis culture.

COLDEST NIGHT OF THE YEAR

Brrrr.....It's The Coldest Night of the Year

On Saturday, February 22nd, two members of the Homeless & Affordable Housing Team will be walking for the Coldest Night of the Year event held in Sarnia.
