

Welcome to the monthly financial column for the Family of Parishes. In this edition, we will be reporting on our first month of operation for 2025 and provide a quick update on our snow clearing efforts.

January included four offertory collections and one Holy Day of Obligation. The January tally was comparable to November 2024, December being a special month of generosity for the faithful. Being very early in the year, it is hard to predict how 2025 will unfold. The Finance Council is keeping a close eye on expenses and have provided several constructive suggestions as to where we could exercise fiscal efficiencies.

#### **New Communication Strategy**

One such efficiency being investigated is how we communicate with parishioners. To help us increase our evangelization outreach, we welcomed a new staff member, dedicated to Social Media communication. Alyssa Minten arrived in the position in February after having been identified as the successful candidate of a competitive process.

The Finance Council has supported the creation of this new position at the recommendation of the Communication Team. We (Finance Council) believe this is a critical step in changing the perception outsiders might have of our Faith. We are currently developing tools to evaluate the effectiveness of the various ways we communicate and their outcomes. More about it in the coming months.

#### **Snow Clearing**

Do you like snow? I hope you do because we had a bunch of it this year. This is the first season the Family of Parishes has not contracted out snow clearing for sidewalks. This year, it has been done by parish caretakers and volunteers. Being an unusual snowy and cold year proved challenging at times.

Our next step is to evaluate the outcome and analyze the lessons learned to guide us for next winter. Please feel free to share with us your experiences and comments as to how well we did and how we could do better.

# INDULGENCE: MEANING, TYPES AND PRACTICE IN THE JUBILEE YEAR

Sin has consequences. Catholic doctrine teaches us that sin has eternal consequence and temporal (*natural*) consequence. Gladly, Christ through his death on the cross, paid the eternal price for the eternal consequence of our sins; the temporal consequence of sin, however, requires us to carry out certain works or spiritual exercises which can heal the wounds caused by our sin. Illustratively, if I break my neighbour's window, I can be forgiven for the action, but that doesn't replace the window. I can either spend the money myself to replace the window, or someone can help me pay for it. No matter how, the window has to be replaced. The payment has to be satisfied. That satisfaction is what the church calls indulgence.

By definition therefore, indulgence is "a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints" (CCC 1471).

From the above definition, indulgence as understood and used in the church has no connotation with the everyday usage of the word 'indulge', 'indulgent' or 'self-indulgence' which connote a somewhat moral softness. Indulgence rightly understood is not a permission to commit sin; it is not an alternative to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Rather, it is an exercise of the forgiving authority of the church (*Confer Matt 16:19; Matt 18:18*) intent on not merely providing aid to Christians, but also "to spur them to works of devotion, penance and charity" (CCC 1478).

Indulgences are of two kinds, namely plenary or partial. A partial indulgence covers part of the punishment due for sins, while a plenary indulgence removes all of it. If we were to gain fully a plenary indulgence and were to die immediately afterwards, we would be with God in heaven immediately without any need for atonement in purgatory.

To obtain a plenary indulgence, therefore, one needs to:

- 1. Be in the state of Grace: that is being free from venial and mortal sin, usually through sacramental confession (at least before the completion of the indulgence work).
- 2. Receive Holy Communion.
- 3. Pray for the intentions of the Pope (*Usually by saying One Our Father, and One Hail Mary or any other prayer as may seem fit by the individual*).
- 4. Detachment from sin.

These conditions mentioned above are necessary conditions that the faithful should fulfill in carrying out the proscribed indulgence work for procurement of a plenary indulgence. If all are not fulfilled perfectly, the indulgence procured is said to be a partial indulgence.

It is important to note that while one must have an intention for seeking an indulgence, one can also apply an indulgence for the good of oneself or for the soul of a deceased in purgatory, but never for another living person. By rule, only one indulgence can be obtained a day, but a second is granted if offered for the soul in purgatory.

For the sake of Christ Faithful, the Holy Father has declared the year 2025 a Jubilee Year with the theme PILGRIMS OF HOPE. The following are proscribed works that the faithful can carry out to obtain a plenary indulgence:

# INDULGENCE: MEANING, TYPES AND PRACTICE IN THE JUBILEE YEAR

**Go on a Pilgrimage:** Certain Holy destinations are approved to gain a plenary indulgence; such as: the 4 Papal Basilicas in Rome, Some Churches, and the Catacombs. In our Diocese, our Cathedral in London, Our Lady of Mercy Parish and some other Churches have been designated as indulgence sites too. This physical journey also provides for a transforming spiritual experience through encounter with God and other pilgrims.



**Perform Works of Mercy:** The Faithful can obtain indulgence also by carrying out the spiritual or corporal works of mercy such as visiting prisoners, spending time with lonely ,elderly people, aiding the sick or disabled, and helping those who are in need. These are seen as a form of 'pilgrimage to Christ who is present in them'.

**Carry out 'Acts of Penance':** 'acts of penance' means 'any act or a set of actions done out of repentance for sins committed'. Some include Fasting, Abstinence (from social media, TV, Chit-Chat, Entertainment), Supporting Religious Work, Donating to a Cause (supporting Immigrants, the poor), Volunteering to Service.

**Study the Vatican II Document:** By devoutly participating in a retreat, study group, or spiritual exercise on the 'documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place'.

Uniting Spiritually with those on Pilgrimage: those who cannot go on pilgrimage or make a visit to a sacred place for serious reasons will be able to gain the Indulgence wherever they are by uniting themselves spiritually with those who do so, and reciting the Our Father, the Creed, and other prayers connected with the Holy Year, while offering up their sufferings or hardships. This option makes the grace of indulgence available to prisoners, the confined, the handicapped and the sick amongst others.

### HOMILY: 5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C - DEACON DAVID CUMMINGS

There are two words we hear a lot: "disciple" and "apostle".

**A disciple** is one who studies the teaching of a master. For us here, I hope, we are all disciples of Jesus Christ. And we have a number of opportunities available to do this as individuals and as families, whether events organized at the Parish, Family of Parishes, Deanery or Diocesan level, or just something simple like reading the Sunday readings before Mass, to be more open and receptive to God's Word for us.

An Apostle is one who is sent. In today's readings, we hear a lot about different apostles: Isiah, Paul, Cephas (Peter), the twelve, James, and of course, the fishermen. Sent to participate in the Ministry of Christ. And like discipleship, there are lots of opportunities for ministry throughout this parish! Think about it: Greeters and Commentators, Music Ministers, Catechists for Children's Liturgy, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of the Blessed Sacrament – all these are ways we can share in the Ministry of Christ, ways of being sent to serve God's people!

The challenge is that sometimes, we reduce these ministries to just a series of mundane tasks we do. When trying to FORM people for a ministry, what I often get is "Just tell me what I have to do!" When your focus is solely on the "What" you miss the entire point.

It is not about the "what", but rather it is about the "who". Who we do it for, who it is being done through, and with and in. Ministry is fundamentally and profoundly relational – relational in Christ!

We talk a lot about evangelization and bringing people into the Church. And we see some results. But when we switch from just doing a "job" to "letting Christ work through us", the results go from ordinary to extraordinary!

As ministers of hospitality, we can be gracious and welcoming. But united to Christ, it is as if Christ himself extends hospitality, inviting Zacchaeus to come down from the sycamore tree.

As music ministers, we can make beautiful music. But united to Christ, it is as if Christ himself fills the hearts of his people with gratitude to sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to our God.

As lectors, we can read well. But, lending our human voice to God, it is as if Christ himself speaks God's tender words of mercy and love to the crowd on the shore.

As a Deacon, I can read the Gospel. But conformed unto the ministry of Christ, I am charged with the responsibility of proclaiming the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and of making that Divine and Living Word present for His people.

As a priest, Fr Edward can celebrate Mass. But conformed unto Christ the Head, he makes present for us the sacrifice of the cross, so that our offerings become true food and true drink that Christ may abide in us.

As ministers of the Blessed Sacrament, we can give communion, but united to Christ, it is as if Christ himself, having compassion for his people, feeds them, offering spiritual nourishment.

For our ministries to be fruitful, we must be properly formed. The Family of Parishes has offered different opportunities to look at the practical aspects of ministry (the "what"), but also I invite you to seek out opportunities to go deeper into the spiritual aspects of your liturgical ministry. Maybe prayerfully read the General Instruction on the Roman Missal, the GIRM. It is available on the Canadian Conference Catholic Bishops (CCCB) website.

We must also be properly prepared. How can I properly proclaim the Word of God if I haven't spent any time with it?

But first and foremost, we must be united to Christ in prayer. How can I serve Him if I have not sought out his grace? If I am not open to the movements of his spirit.

### HOMILY: 5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C - DEACON DAVID CUMMINGS

One last thought, when I was just newly ordained, we had prepared a preaching schedule and I was scheduled to preach at a weekday mass. Unfortunately, around that time, I had a family member in hospital in London. So, I had texted Father to say I wouldn't be able to preach on a particular Saturday as planned. Well, something happened and I ended up coming to Mass, but not prepared to preach, assuming he had read my text. Well, he had not. Basically, I needed to come up with a homily quickly. All through the opening rites and first reading, I was drawing a blank. After proclaiming the Gospel, I paused, and in my heart, asked God to let the people hear what he wanted them to hear. I can't remember what I said, but afterwards, someone came up to me and shared how something I said had touched that person. That this person had been touched was not because of anything I had done; it was only because I let the Holy Spirit work through me. It is only by cooperating with the grace of God within us that we can share his Good News in the deep waters of our world; to respond to his call "Here am I; send me!"




For every \$500 a KofC Council donates to the pregnancy centre, our Supreme Council will also donate \$100 to a maximum of \$500.
