

JULIA STECCA MONTEIRO — PILGRIM OF HOPE — ROME



Hello, my name is Julia Stecca Monteiro. I'm 18 years old, and I've been a parishioner at the Sarnia Bluewater Roman Catholic Family of Parishes since I can remember, and have always been on the search for more opportunities to grow in my faith.

As a young person, I find that the environments that help deepen my relationship with God are often when I'm surrounded by other young people with strong faiths. It's so important to see how the Church is still alive within our youth - even if it's not always evident in every city. Recently, I went to Rome and the Vatican for Holy Week. I spent the time there visiting historical sites, praying before relics I never dreamed of seeing, and going to talks by women, for women. It was also beautiful that I was able to meet girls that I now consider my closest friends, despite only

spending nine days getting to know them. Being surrounded by other faithful is important for everyone, and this really helped me. I should also note, this was not a trip, but a pilgrimage. We walked a lot, did many penances, and also rejoiced with our full hearts. In Rome, how could you not? Easter in a city with so much history was an unfathomable blessing. The vigil was so touching, and the gelato after was the cherry on top. Most of all, the experience left me thinking of how blessed I am. I was one of the five youth to go to UNIV (an international meeting of young university women) this year from all of Canada, and while other countries had numbers nearing a hundred, I understand how many other youth in Canada have prayed to be in my place. The reason I was able to go, was in large part, because of many of you, alongside the sacrifices my parents made for me. The trip was priceless, but it did cost quite a bit, and I wouldn't have been able to experience these unique things: meeting the Pope on his last days, passing through the four Holy doors and getting plenary indulgences, and having Good Friday mass with so many of our cardinals in St. Peter Basilica. So as much as you were able to bless me with this opportunity, I hope you will consider aiding other youth in our community. There's always something going on that is in need of donations, and I pray that financial issues don't stay in the way of faith blossoming in more of our youth. What comes to mind is Steubenville... I was able to go when I was 16, and it gave me so much confidence in knowing the sheer number of people that are fervently Catholic, who might also have been going through the same obstacles as me. It was what led to the shift in my faith, and I could not be here in front of you all without it. This opportunity was also gifted to me generously by our parishioners, and sometimes people don't realize how a small contribution can make a huge difference within our community. It was such a cornerstone of my faith as an insecure teen, and I believe it's so important to fight to make this happen this year to the best of our abilities. So please, pray for every trip the youth take. Because truly, you will never realize how big your impact is. I also recognize how difficult offering financial aid is for some, and I want you to know I deeply appreciate all the help you all have offered me throughout the years.

Thank you all for your prayers, contributions, and for listening to me today. Please, keep praying for me.



A Catholic pilgrimage is a journey to a holy place or site, undertaken by individuals or groups, for spiritual purposes. These sites are often associated with the Catholic faith, such as shrines, churches, places of miracles, or where saints lived or were martyred. Pilgrimages are a way to deepen faith, seek blessings, and connect with God in a unique way.

Our Lady of Mercy Church has been designated a Jubilee Pilgrimage Site by the Diocese of London. From Thursday, July 17 to Saturday, July 19, Our Lady of Mercy Church will be open from 9am to 4pm for prayer, adoration, confession, Mass and quiet reflection. There will be opportunity to explore and discover the many unique features that make this Church a treasure in our Catholic community.

Many have walked the Camino de Santiago seeking spiritual growth and ending their journey at the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Spain. On Saturday, July 19, we invite you to make a pilgrimage to Our Lady of Mercy with our Jubilee Camino experience.

Gather your family and friends and start your walk, jog or bike from any one of our 7 churches and end at Our Lady of Mercy in time for the 12:10pm Mass. Join your fellow pilgrims in the parish hall after Mass for refreshments and fellowship. 

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that an indulgence is a remission (cancellation) before God of the temporal punishment due to sins of those whose sins have already been forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance.

Under certain specified conditions, the Church as God's instrument of mercy, grants an indulgence as an expression of God's mercy.

An indulgence is partial or plenary, in that it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin.

Indulgences may be applied to the living or the dead.

The Jubilee indulgence is intended to be a full or plenary indulgence.

There are 4 conditions to be met in order to receive this grace:

- * Make a good Confession and participate in a Mass and receive Holy Communion
- * Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, by saying the Our Father, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be
- * Visit a designated holy site, such as pilgrimage churches, or another sacred place
- * Perform works of mercy or penance.

The works of mercy would include participating in a parish mission, formation activities based on the documents of Vatican II or the Catechism, and any of the corporal works of mercy (feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, welcoming the stranger, visiting the sick or imprisoned, or burying the dead).

Other works of mercy include counseling the doubtful, instructing the ignorant, admonishing sinners, comforting the afflicted, forgiving offences, bearing patiently with those who do us ill, and praying for the living and the dead.

The works of penance to obtain the indulgence might include participating in the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office), the Way of the Cross, the Rosary, or a penitential celebration with individual confession.
