Tony Hogervorst and his wife Joanne are vegetable growers north of Watford, and attend Our Lady Help of Christians Parish in Watford.

Since about 1990 ... Tony would take his Mexican Workers to Spanish Mass every month or so. Spanish Masses were originally in Sarnia, while they were available, at St. Benedict Church with Fr. Tom Lever. Then the Spanish Masses were celebrated with the Latino Community in London.

Around 2008 ... Tony and his wife Joanne, with the Diocese of London Migrant Worker Specialist at the time, Marie Carter, and others who are committed to social justice, initiated a monthly (in season) Spanish Mass, at Our Lady Help of Christians Parish in Watford.

Spanish Masses for the Migrant Workers and Community were eventually moved to St. Christopher Church in Forest, for the larger Hall. A very loyal and dedicated Team of volunteers serve supper after Mass.

Then came the day when Deacon Tony said, "Yes" to God's call to the Deaconate Studies at St Peter's Seminary. Joanne accompanied Tony through formation at the Seminary as well.

Deacon Tony is truly a "Welcomer"... always welcoming everyone ... even when you're standing outside in the parking lot of the church before Mass.

As a Husband and Wife Team, Joanne is a valuable support for Deacon Tony ... as he ministers as a Deacon to the wider community of the Lambton County Catholic Family of Parishes.



TRUTH & RECONCILIATION

On May 5th, Red Dress Day in Canada, our Family of Parishes honoured missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls by displaying a red dress in each of our 7 Churches. At the same time, we also presented The Moose Hide Campaign. Postcards with moose hide attached is an Indigenous-led grassroots movement of men and boys – and all Canadians – who are standing up against violence towards women and children. Wear orange

On September 30, our Family of Parishes will mark National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, also known as Orange Shirt Day and Every Child Matters.

The day honours the children who never returned home as well as survivors of residential schools, their families and communities. Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

On September 30, we encourage all Canadians to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools.

Pikangikum Partnership God with us!

As of July 12th, Pikangikum First Nations has been under evacuation order to leave the community due to the forest fires 7 Km away.

This is a very tumultuous time for Pikangikum families, as relocation incites a lot of confusion, anxiety and distress for the people who find living in a city both challenging and upsetting. To give a little insight into what the community has experienced this summer, here is an excerpt from Missionary Colleen Estes recent report.

"6 hydro poles have been damaged leaving the community without electricity except at the school and personal generators. The report tonight is that it won't be fixed any time soon. Food supplies are short. Water is being flown in." In light of the forest fire situation all summer long, Theresa vanKeoverden has postponed her exposure trip to Pikangikum until late October.

Please pray for the community of Pikangikum and all communities who have, and continue to, experience forest fires and the tragic loss and devastation that they leave behind. Please pray also for Colleen as she continues to deal with post surgery health concerns.

On a lighter note, I share a lovely excerpt from Missionary Assistant. Nicholas Backlund.

Nicholas wrote, "Life has been filled with many good things... having Nightlight open hanging out with young people.

At the June 12th Homeless & Affordable Housing Ministry meeting, Jim Curran announced that he has started a non-profit called "Connect Sarnia". Jim purchased the former Nightlight downtown location at 181 Christina St. North. Nightlight transitioned to Connect Sarnia on July 3rd, 2025. The open house was held on August 1st.

Jim reported, "The rationale for the change is local control and autonomy over decision making, finances and strategy. We are grateful for Nightlight's vision and helping start the downtown ministry and are ready to take over as our own local charity". Each year during the growing season, men, and some women, from many southern countries come to work in the fields, greenhouses and processing plants in South Western Ontario, as many as twenty thousand.

They are often housed onsite at the work location which is often outside the city or town and where shopping and entertainment options are very limited.

The Diocese of London has a Migrant Worker program that helps the workers navigate the government systems and provides some social gatherings so they have a chance to meet others and have some fun together.

As a welcome to the workers, SSVP volunteered to open its Thrift Store in Forest, on Sunday May 25th and the East St. store in Sarnia, on June 1st. The workers were given a free voucher worth \$50 to spend at these locations.

In Forest, 50 workers were picked up from various locations by volunteers and brought to the store. Similarly, the Sarnia store hosted 39 workers the next week.

All the men and women were very happy for the chance to shop.


KofC Meat Bingos - Summer Break
