May you and your loved ones find peace, HOPE, and love throughout this Fall season.



#### HISTORY OF THE HOLY MARY OF THE ROSARY STATUE

LOCATED AT OUR LADY OF MERCY CHURCH



The Holy Rosary Society – more formally known as The Holy Mary of the Rosary Association – originated in the town of Vicalvi in the Italian province of Frosinone. In 1932, a group of Italian Catholic men formed their own Holy Rosary Society in Detroit, Michigan which a number of Sarnia men were able to become members to their group.

Its main purpose at that time was to retain their religion, traditions, culture alive while being separated from their loved ones. As well, assisting with its local Italian immigration which had already begun.

In 1978, Sarnia members formed their own registered non-profit organization officially separating from the Michigan group (due to travel distance etc.) The group would hold their membership meetings/activities in the now-closed St. Peter's Catholic Church. At that time, a strong Italian congregation were present at St. Peter's Church which serviced an Italian Sunday mass to its parishioners. Upon the church's closing, the group moved their activities to Our Lady of Mercy Catholic Church at the corner of Christina Street and London Road, Sarnia.

While at St. Peter's Church, its members commissioned sculptor Antonio Caruso, whose studio was located in Alliston, Ontario, to create the beautiful statue of the Holy Mary holding baby Jesus. The gowns that adorn Mary/Jesus were handsewn by Mrs. Lea Rocco – a talented local seamstress and parishioner. This statue is now located at Our Lady of Mercy Catholic Church in Sarnia. In recent years, its aging membership had difficulties recruiting new members to

keep the group alive. A hard challenge it was; ultimately, the decision to fold was voted on and the official group did, indeed, close in 2023. At its closing, significant amount of remaining money was donated to various local charities including Our Lady of Mercy Church.

The Holy Rosary Society members took pride in the fact that the statue of the Holy Mary of the Rosary would be housed at the beautiful Our Lady of Mercy Church in Sarnia.

Her Feast Day is celebrated on October 7<sup>th</sup>.

# SOCIAL JUSTICE & MISSIONS



Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters".

The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

Orange Shirt Day initiated, and continues to allow for conversations about residential schools on an international scale, and allows for meaningful discussions of the impacts and legacies of residential schools.

The orange shirt, inspired by Phyllis (Jack) Webstad's experience of having her orange shirt, given to her by her grandmother, taken away upon arrival to the Mission school. The orange color reminded Webstad of her experience and "how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and how I felt like I was worth nothing. All of us little children were crying and no one cared."

On September 30, we encourage all Canadians to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools.




