Ellen Harbaugh taught in the Marshalltown Catholic schools for nearly 25 years, most of those as a kindergarten teacher. "My wife was very dedicated to it," said Dan Harbaugh. "She was a firm believer if you took kindergarten there, you'd stay in the same school."

Dan added, "We felt a faith-based education was very important. Hopefully it puts a small kernel in their soul and it stays with them."

Sue Fink, a fellow teacher and friend, said, "Ellen recognized the gifts in her students and worked to bring out those gifts. If a student was having difficulty she would get to the bottom of the problem and even tutor them if that was what would help."

Ellen lived with type I diabetes for 55 years. She died of complications from the disease on May 9, 2021. There was no doubt students loved her. "She was using a wheel chair the last couple of years she taught, but could still walk a bit," Dan noted. "After a school Mass, a parent helped her walk back to the school. The kids were all lined up and gave her the queen wave," Dan explained, like royalty gives when in a parade.

Sue added, "When Ellen got to the point of needing a walker to get around her classroom, she didn't see it as a bad thing. She even let her students play 'Mrs. Harbaugh' when they had indoor recess. They would walk around the room wearing her little half glasses and walker and pretend they were teaching."

"We started to look at a fund from the beginning in her name and her honor," Dan said. He started the Ellen L. Harbaugh Tuition Fund for tuition assistance to families with financial need who have a student in kindergarten at St. Francis Catholic Schools in Marshalltown. "A lot of these students wouldn't be at a Catholic school without some help." Dan notes.

Dan wanted an endowment so the fund would continue its impact while growing to help even more in the future. "It's the power of a good investment and patience." He chose CFAD because of its financial stability. "I knew you would be in existence a long time and so the funds deposited and earned would be here for students a long time in the future."

And the fund always will be given in honor of Ellen for her love of her students and teaching at a Catholic school.

CFAD initiated the St. Katharine Drexel Grant in fiscal year 2023. Catholic organizations in the Archdiocese of Dubuque may apply for this discretionary grant for new projects that provide a Work of Mercy needed in their area and/or new evangelization efforts to bring people closer to Christ and His Church.

Of the 19 applicants for fiscal year 2023, six received grants:

- Beckman High School Dyersville for service learning with Catholic organizations outside of the school/parish
- Catholic Charities Archdiocese of Dubuque for new community building programs for affordable housing clients at Ecumenical Tower in Dubuque
- Church of the Nativity Dubuque for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd
- St. Pius X Church Cedar Rapids for parish-based volunteer training to help area refugee resettlement and immigration programs
- Seton Catholic Farley for a Bible study for teachers
- Xavier High School Cedar Rapids for its off-campus Catholic social teaching course


# Joyful Giving Options to Help Our Catholic Community

Donor Advised Fund: a "charitable investment account" that's invested. can grow tax-free and the donor decides when and to whom to advise grants

Future Fund: an agreement for an endowment to be funded in the future, typically with a legacy gift or some other planned asset

Current Fund: Give today or leave a legacy gift to one of our many established funds


