About the Cover – pictured on the bulletin cover is the Paschal Candle. It burned brightly in a prominent place by the ambo for the 50 days of Easter. It is one of the pre-eminent symbols of Christ who is our light and our Salvation with its own hymn of praise sung at the Easter Vigil. The Paschal Candle is traditionally made of at least 51% beeswax. During the Easter Vigil before being lit by the new fire, a Cross is carved in it on which five nails (with incense) are placed representing the five wounds of Christ. The alpha and the omega (the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet) are incised above and below the Cross. Christ said of himself "I am the alpha and the omega, the beginning and the end..." The numerals of the current year are also added. After the Easter Season, the Paschal Candle is stored in the baptistery. Lit again for Baptisms, the neophyte receives their own candle lit from the Paschal Candle with the words "Receive the Light of Christ..." During a funeral, the deceased lies near the lit candle, a reminder of the great dignity we have through our Baptism into Christ's life, death, and Resurrection. Our candle this year has a Eucharistic motif and is entitled "Adoro Te Devote," a Latin hymn we may know better as "Humbly, We Adore Thee." Take a close look at the candle and you'll see entwining tendrils of grapes with the Cross reminiscent of a monstrance. (That'll be another article.) Also, you can find on it a pelican feeding its young. (That'll be another article too.) But in the meantime, look for the image of a pelican and her young in the stained-glass windows of our church.

Message from Fr. Hinterschied

This week, Holy Mother Church venerates her two greatest Apostles, Peter and Paul. These men are the solid rock on which the Church is built. They are at the origin of her faith and will forever remain her protectors and her guides. To them Rome owes her own greatness, for it was under God's providential guidance that they were led to make the capital of the Empire, sanctified by their martyrdom, the center of the Christian world from which should radiate the preaching of the Gospel. St. Peter suffered martyrdom under Nero, in A.D. 66 or 67. He was buried on the hill of the Vatican where excavations have revealed his tomb on the very site of the Basilica of St. Peter's. St. Paul was beheaded in the Via Ostia on the spot where now stands the basilica bearing his name. Down the centuries, Christians have gone on pilgrimage to the tombs of these Apostles.

O God, whose right hand raised up blessed Peter, when he walked upon the water and began to sink, and thrice delivered his fellow-Apostle Paul from the depths of the sea, when he suffered shipwreck: graciously hear us and grant, by the merits of them both, that we also may attain unto everlasting glory: Who livest and reignest, world without end. LIFE-GIVING TOUCH

Reflection on Mark 5:21-43

I am a hugger. Adjusting to the practice of social-distancing in this post-pandemic world was not easy for me. Touch conveys so much more than affection. There is a healing, loving, merciful power in human touch, which is why our sacramental rituals use human touch to convey so much meaningful truth of God's presence to us.

In reaching out to touch the cloak of Jesus, the woman afflicted with hemorrhages certainly displays the human desire for connection and love we all have. But she also is courageous in her faith, as Jesus acknowledges. It is interesting that Jesus does not know who touched Him, and we must not conclude from this that He is some kind of vending machine dispensing healing at the touch of a button. Rather, Jesus uses this encounter to seek this woman out and to call her, "daughter." How marvelous, how intimate this designation of belonging must have sounded in her ears! To be a "son" or a "daughter" is to be in a generative relationship with our "father" and "mother." Not only is this woman cured of her 12-year physical affliction, but she is also healed of her isolation and drawn more deeply into that relationship with Jesus that gives life, and always changes the direction of our lives.

ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE

Feast Day: July 3 • Patron Saint of Doubt, Builders and Architects

Thomas, also called the Twin or the Apostle of India, was a beloved friend of Jesus; however, he is more widely remembered for his strong doubt that Jesus would rise from the dead. He needed proof of Jesus' resurrection and was allowed to touch the wounds of the Lord after the crucifixion. Thomas traveled all over Persia and India spreading the Word of Christ. His symbol is the builder's square because of the parishes and churches he erected in the areas that he passed through. His life was taken around the year 72 while he was in India.




