Break-in at St. Norbert’s

Dear Parishioners,

You may have heard that there was a break-in at St. Norbert’s which was discovered the morning of January 22.

The vandal(s) entered through the front door that had accidentally been left unlocked. The tabernacle was on the floor, the door was open, but it did not appear that the Eucharist was touched. The hallway entrance to the sacristy was breached by destroying the lock to get in. There was some damage to the door. Once in the sacristy, they proceeded to pilfer through all the drawers and cabinets. All the sacred vessels were scattered on the counter. Nothing was emptied out of the vestment drawers, though they were all opened but the monstrance which was in its case in the vestment closet was opened, smashed and the top part (the part that looks like jewels) was taken. The sacred vessels that are used regularly remain, though it is hard to tell if some of the older pieces were taken. Though things were a mess, there did not seem to be any intentional defaming or destruction. No spewing of the Eucharist, no graffiti, no obvious defamation. They also went through all the storage drawers in the educational supply closet. They did not get into the Julien Room. There were two monstrances at St. Michael’s, so we have a replacement monstrance at St. Norbert’s.

We offer prayers for the person(s) who would commit such an act.

Greensboro Community Wastewater Disposal System Project

You may have heard or read that the town of Greensboro is investigating the purchase of some land from our parish at St. Michael’s for part of their Community Wastewater Disposal System. Fr.
