St. James the Apostle

Saint of the Day for July 25

(d. 44)

This James is the brother of John the Evangelist. The two were called by Jesus as they worked with their father in a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee. Jesus had already called another pair of brothers from a similar occupation: Peter and Andrew. "He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him" (*Mark 1:19-20*).

James was one of the favored three who had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration, the raising to life of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in Gethsemani.

Two incidents in the Gospels describe the temperament of this man and his brother. Saint Matthew tells that their mother came—Mark says it was the brothers themselves—to ask that they have the seats of honor in the kingdom. "Jesus said in reply, 'You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink?' They said to him, 'We can'" (*Matthew 20:22*). Jesus then told them they would indeed drink the cup and share his baptism of pain and death, but that sitting at his right hand or left was not his to give—it "is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father" (*Matthew 20:23b*). It remained to be seen how long it would take to realize the implications of their confident "We can!"

The other disciples became indignant at the ambition of James and John. Then Jesus taught them all the lesson of humble service: The purpose of authority is to serve. They are not to impose their will on others, or lord it over them. This is the position of Jesus himself. He was the servant of all; the service imposed on him was the supreme sacrifice of his own life.

On another occasion, James and John gave evidence that the nickname Jesus gave them—"sons of thunder"—was an apt one. The Samaritans would not welcome Jesus because he was on his way to hated Jerusalem. "When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?' Jesus turned and rebuked them..." (*Luke 9:54-55*).

James was apparently the first of the apostles to be martyred. "About that time King Herod laid hands upon some members of the church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also" (*Acts 12:1-3a*).

This James, sometimes called James the Greater, is not to be confused with James the Lesser or with the author of the *Letter of James* and the leader of the Jerusalem community.

Reflection: The way the Gospels treat the apostles is a good reminder of what holiness is all about. There is very little about their virtues as static possessions, entitling them to heavenly reward. Rather, the great emphasis is on the Kingdom, on God's giving them the power to proclaim the Good News.

As far as their personal lives are concerned, there is much about Jesus' purifying them of narrowness, pettiness, fickleness.

What do you want Him to do for you?

When we go out to reach hurting people we frequently ask God to take us to the person who needs a touch from Him. On this Saturday we would find Teresa, a frail woman lying on a blanket by the highway. Teresa is the name we will give her. I noticed a hospital band around her tiny wrist and thought, "what an uncomfortable place to recuperate in with this hot, humid, 95 degree Houston weather". I immediately remembered the bible story of the blind beggar named Bartimaeus and asked her if she had heard it. She responded yes! - that she was Catholic and was familiar with the story. I took her back to when Jesus called the blind man over, after he yelled "Jesus Son of David have mercy on me, help me"! Jesus then asked him what he wanted. Obviously Jesus could see that he was blind so why bother to even ask? But he wanted him to speak out what he wanted. She nodded her head in agreement. 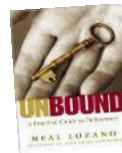

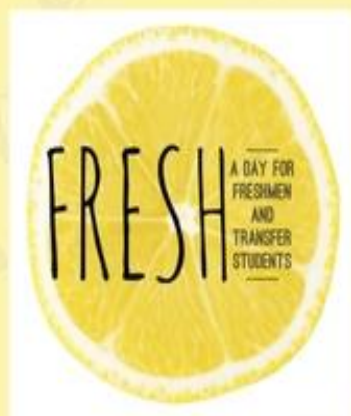

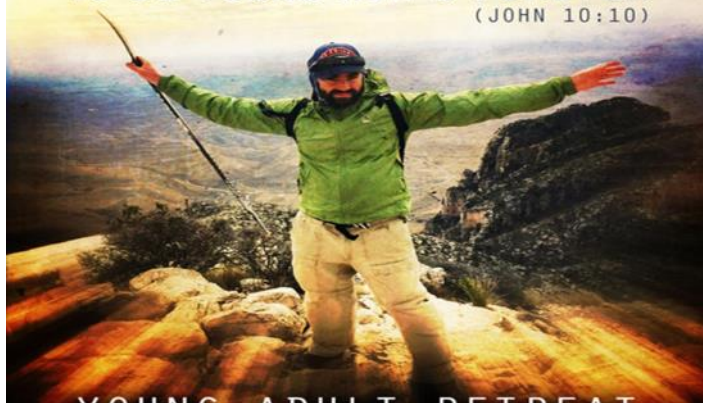

DEJADLOS CRECER JUNTOS HASTA LA SIEGA



Poderoso y Compasivo.- Los textos de este domingo nos ayudan a compaginar dos atributos de Dios: es poderoso y es compasivo. Y es admirable que los dos se proclamen al tiempo de un solo y mismo Dios, porque nuestra experiencia suele ser que los que tienen mucho poder tienen poca misericordia, mientras que los muy comprensivos resultan inhábiles para alcanzar el mando. Parece ser que la clave de la unión entre estas dos cualidades divinas es que ambas son infinitas. El que tiene un poder limitado tiene siempre el temor de perderlo o de que algo escape de su mano. El temor cierra el alma, y de ahí viene la dureza típica de lo que llamamos los "mandos medios." Cuando el único poder que una persona tiene es su estrecha oficina, la persona intenta que todo quepa en sus escasos metros cuadrados y por eso ve con temor que algo se le escape. Se vuelve intransigente e implacable. Lo mismo vale si la persona tiene una compasión limitada. ¿Qué es una compasión limitada? Es la capacidad de perdonar "algunas cosas" pero no todas. Es evidente que una persona así tendrá también un poder escaso, pues basta con ofenderlo más allá de su límite para ponerlo fuera de casillas, es decir, para ponerlo fuera de sí, o sea, fuera del control de sí mismo. En tal evento la persona ofendida ya no tiene poder ni siquiera sobre sus propios pensamientos o acciones. Dios, en cambio, es ilimitado, es infinito, tanto en su poder como en su compasión. Ambas coexisten precisamente porque son infinitas. Lo dice hermosamente la primera lectura del libro de la Sabiduría: "Tu poder es el fundamento de tu justicia, y por ser el Señor de todos, eres misericordioso con todos... Con todo esto has enseñado a tu pueblo que el justo debe ser humano, y has llenado a tus hijos de una dulce esperanza, ya que al pecador le das tiempo para que se arrepienta."

El Grande ayuda al Pequeño.- Podemos reconocer una idea semejante en la segunda lectura de este domingo. También aquí aparece el poder, en este caso el poder del

Espíritu Santo, junto con la misericordia que este Espíritu tiene, abajándose a nuestra naturaleza y moldeándola y transformándola hasta hacerle capaz de modular una oración. Es Dios quien inspira las oraciones que Dios mismo va a escuchar. Parece un absurdo o sólo un juego. No lo es. El domingo pasado reflexionábamos sobre cómo la Palabra nos bendice con la Palabra que anuncia la gracia, y entonces nosotros, una vez bendecidos aprendemos a bendecir al Dios que nos ha dado esa gracia. Nuestra gratitud nace de la gracia y nuestra bendición de la bendición recibida. Hoy vemos el mismo ciclo, el mismo misterio, pero referido al Espíritu Santo, que enviado por el Padre, nos toca y nos levanta, nos hace espirituales y celestiales, de modo que nuestra oración sea concorde con su fuente y con su término, que es Dios mismo.

Misericordia significa Tiempo.- En el evangelio de hoy, la misma idea resuena en otra tesitura. Todos necesitamos compasión. Ahora bien la compasión quiere hacer de nosotros personas distintas y nuevas, seres distintos de lo que somos. Y como por otra parte estamos dotados de libertad, alcanzar ese nuevo ser requiere de tiempo, lo mismo que una planta enferma que necesita nutrirse para dar sus frutos. Por eso la compasión toma el rostro de "tiempo." Si nosotros necesitamos de tiempo, y si además podemos contar con ese tiempo, es porque la misericordia de Dios se vuelve paciencia. El Dios compasivo es siempre el Dios paciente, el Dios que da tiempo. Pero nuestro tiempo en esta tierra es limitado y por eso hay también un límite al tiempo de espera por nuestra conversión. De nuevo digámoslo: el infinito es Dios y no nosotros. Nuestro tiempo se acaba, y desde ese ángulo hay que decir que nuestra capacidad de recibir la misericordia en forma de tiempo se acaba. Por eso la Biblia afirma las dos cosas: que Dios es paciente pero que esa paciencia se termina en algún punto y llega el momento del juicio. No es que Dios se termine ni que sea finito; los finitos somos nosotros, y porque somos finitos tenemos que apreciar el tiempo que se nos da y apresurarnos en responder al amor con amor.
