



Blessed Marie Rose Durocher

Saint of the Day for October 13 (October 6, 1811 - October 6, 1849)

Canada was one diocese from coast to coast during the first eight years of Marie-Rose Durocher's life. Its

half-million Catholics had received civil and religious liberty from the English only 44 years before. When Marie-Rose was 29, Bishop Ignace Bourget became bishop of Montreal. He would be a decisive influence in her life. He faced a shortage of priests and sisters and a rural population that had been largely deprived of education. Like his counterparts in the United States, Bishop Bourget scoured Europe for help and himself founded four communities, one for which was the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. Its first sister and reluctant co-foundress

was Marie-Rose Durocher. She was born in a little village near Montreal in 1811, the 10th of 11 children. She had a good education, was something of a tomboy, rode a horse named Caesar and could have married well. At 16, she felt the desire to become a religious but was forced to abandon the idea because of her weak constitution. At 18, when her mother died, her priest brother invited her and their father to come to his parish in Beloeil, not far from Montreal.

For 13 years, Marie-Rose served as housekeeper, hostess, and parish worker. She became well-known for her graciousness, courtesy, leadership, and tact; she was, in fact, called "the saint of Beloeil." Perhaps she was too tactful during two years when her brother treated her coldly.

As a young woman, Marie-Rose had hoped there would someday be a community of teaching sisters in every parish, never thinking she would found one. But her spiritual director, Fr. Pierre Telmon, O.M.I., after thoroughly—and severely—leading her in the spiritual life, urged her to found a community herself. Bishop Bourget concurred, but Marie-Rose shrank from the prospect. She was in poor health and her father and bother needed her.

Finally Marie-Rose agreed, and with two friends, Melodie Dufresne and Henriette Cere, entered a little home in Longueuil, across the Saint Lawrence River from Montreal. With them were 13 young girls already assembled for boarding school. Longueuil became her Bethlehem, Nazareth, and Gethsemane. Marie-Rose was 32 and would live only six more years—years filled with poverty, trials, sickness, and slander. The qualities she had nurtured in her "hidden" life came forward—a strong will, intelligence and common sense, great inner courage, and yet a great deference to directors. Thus was born an international congregation of women religious dedicated to education in the

Marie-Rose was severe with herself and by today's standards quite strict with her sisters. Beneath it all, of course, was an unshakable love of her crucified Savior.

On her deathbed, the prayers most frequently on her lips were "Jesus, Mary, Joseph! Sweet Jesus, I love you. Jesus, be to me Jesus! Before she died, Marie-Rose smiled and said to the sister with her, "Your prayers are keeping me here—let me go." She was beatified in 1982.

Reflection We have seen a great burst of charity, a genuine interest in the poor. Countless Christians have experienced a deep form of prayer. But penance? We squirm when we read of terrible physical penance of the proposal like Maria Rose Duragher. That is not for most ance done by people like Marie-Rose Durocher. That is not for most people, of course. But the pull of a materialistic culture oriented to pleasure and entertainment is impossible to resist without some form of deliberate and Christ-conscious abstinence. By Mary Martha Primerano Joseph is an 86 year old man who rides his bike throughout the neighborhood where our church is located. We have known Joseph for several years and on this particular Saturday he seemed a little disturbed. He explained to us that the little apartment he rented for many years is no longer available to him, so for the past few days he was paying for a small room in a nearby motel, but at \$60.00 a night he could no longer afford this. We asked what he would do and he no longer attord this. We asked what he would do and he told us his plan was to ride his bicycle to the Salvation Army to see if they could help. We asked if he would be interested in staying with some of our friends who have started a rehab for men. He quickly agreed and handed us 3 plastic grocery bags filled with items. Joseph instructed us to keep these bags in our car so he could make his way to the Men's home on his bicycle. He also smiled and told us, "Just make sure you keep up!" We all smiled at one another and quickly jumped in our cars so that we would be there when he arrived. Once there all the men were gentle towards Joseph. We soon discovered that these three plastic bags, and his bicycle were the only possessions that he had. We all prayed together with Joseph and thanked God for His provision for our friend in his time of need. I could not help but think of how triend in his time of need. 

¡No al Fatalismo!.- La palabra que no cabe, que nunca cabe en nuestra fe cristiana es "fatalismo." Eso de que hay un destino marcado puede servir para algunas obras literarias o para otras religiones. Nosotros, por el contrario, creemos que el futuro es un libro que no está escrito; un libro en el que tenemos el derecho de escribir nuestras propias páginas. Las lecturas de hoy van en esa línea. Nos invitan, casi digo, nos obligan a reconocer que sí es posible cambiar el rumbo. El ser humano no está hecho sino que se va haciendo a sí mismo. Cada decisión que tomas te convierte de algún modo en un ser distinto. Al escoger una u otra opción frente a ti estás escogiendo también un modo u otro de ser.

Hay un camino: recapacitar.- Por supuesto, el mensaje de la Escritura no es sólo que podemos cambiar sino que podemos mejorar. Nuestra religión es esencialmente un mensaje positivo: la conversión es posible; hoy puedes recapacitar; el resto de tu vida no existe todavía: tú lo llamarás a la existencia. Cambia tu mente, cambia tu corazón y cambiarán también tu vida y tus resultados. En la primera lectura este mensaje aparece como una invitación vigorosa y abierta a todos: "Si el malvado recapacita y se aparta de los delitos cometidos, ciertamente vivirá y no morirá." El malvado es aquel que ha hecho muchos males, aún más: es aquel a quien consideramos malo en sí mismo. Pero esa naturaleza perversa no tiene la última palabra. El mensaje es simple y poderoso: No estás atado a tu pasado malo. Ni siquiera las palabras que tal vez tú mismo hayas dicho tienen por qué atarte. El segundo hijo de la parábola de Cristo el día de hoy fue uno que

había dicho en voz alta: "¡No quiero!" Pero una palabra sabia pero puede deshacer lo que hizo una palabra necia.

Con el poder de Cristo.- Por supuesto, se requiere más que buenos propósitos. Esto lo sabemos todos

los que hemos experimentado cuán débiles somos y con cuánta facilidad quebrantamos nuestras buenas resoluciones. Cristo nos anuncia y nos concede esa fuerza para no sólo reconocer lo que estuvo mal sino para no sentir ya el mismo deseo de repetirlo. La acción de Cristo en nosotros nos cambia el corazón, enseña el Evangelio. Por eso Pablo, en la segunda lectura de hoy nos exhorta con estas palabras: "Tengan los mismos sentimientos que tuvo Cristo Jesús." Es muy dificil obrar como Cristo si uno no es Cristo. Hay que ser uno con él para actuar y vivir como él. Y somos uno con él primero por la fe, creyendo en su mensaje, y luego por el amor, adhiriéndonos a su enseñanza, a su Iglesia y a su Espíritu Santo.
