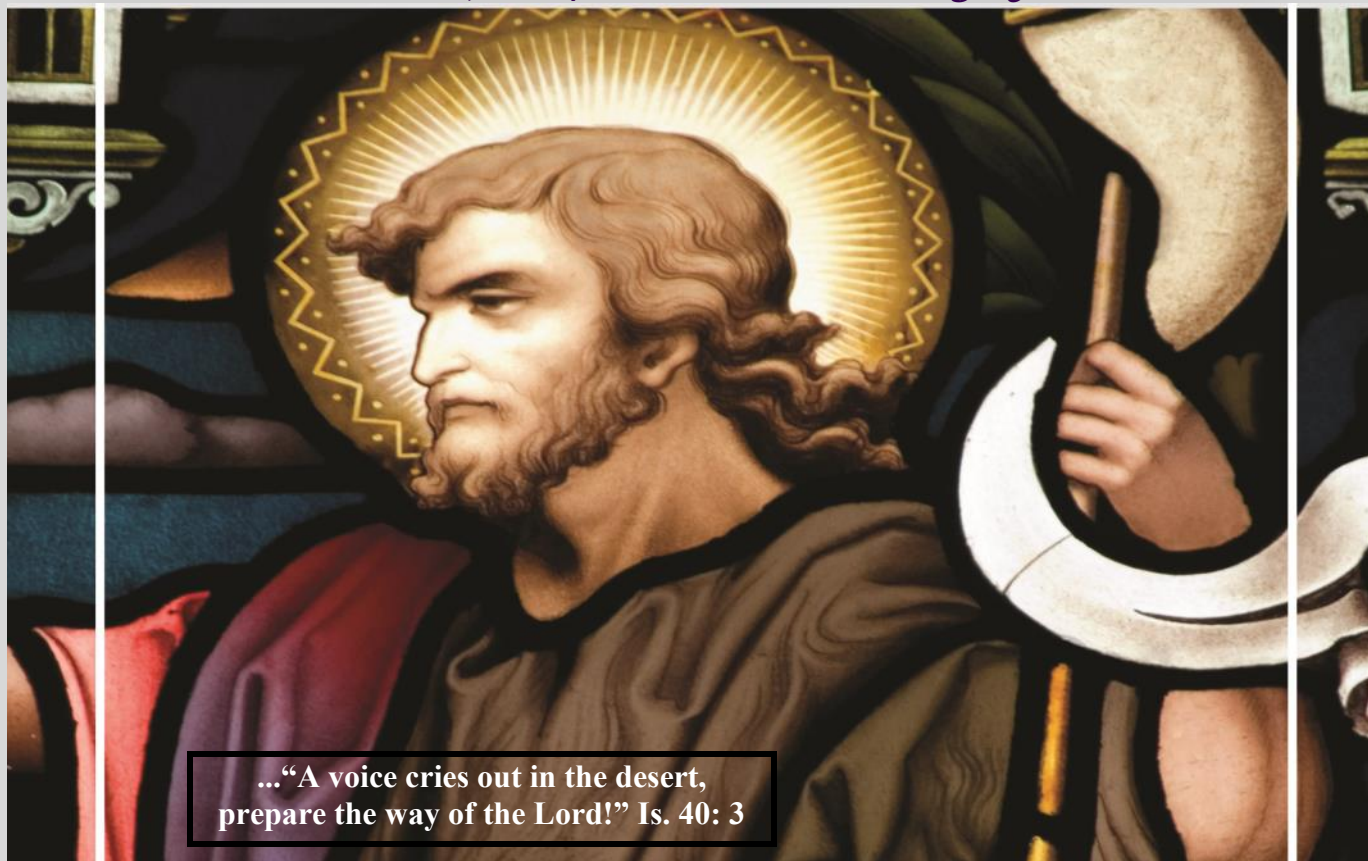

### Just Released!

We've served every kind of person imaginable on the downtown streets of Houston. We consider most of them our friends because we see them often and have developed relationships with them. But in this case a young man who we will call Jim approached us, and stated in his own words that he was just released from jail and needed some prayer. When asked what would he like prayer for? His response was - "Oh just pray for all of us out here on the streets." Well, although this is a nice and good statement to make it was too general for me. I've heard that lots of evangelism takes place in the jails, but in even knowing this I was prompted to ask him if he had every asked Jesus into his heart. Jim immediately answered, "no!" To which I asked (*while thinking to myself strike while the iron is hot*), "would you like to do that now?" And to my pleasant surprise he said, "Yes!!!" And there we (*our team with the homeless*) all got quiet, respected the moment, and stretched out our hands towards him as he invited Jesus to come into his heart and to forgive him of all his sins—and to become Lord of his life. It can only be the Holy Spirit who can soften a person's heart like that. God sent the team to the right place at the right time. Harvest time is now. 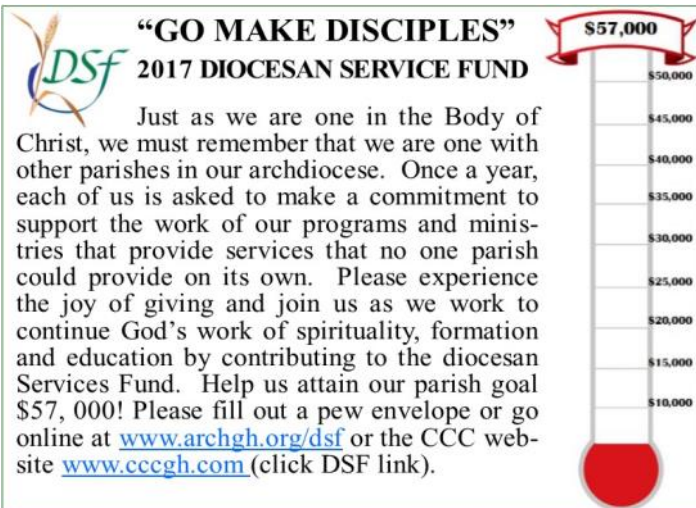

## "MUÉSTRANOS, SEÑOR, TU MISERICORDIA Y DANOS TU SALVACIÓN"



**Juan Bautista.-** Juan, el pariente de Jesús, el hijo de Zacarías e Isabel, el mismo que por su oficio ha sido llamado "el Bautista," es una figura central de nuestro adviento. Es apenas natural: adviento es "espera," tiempo de preparación, y toda la vida y la misión de Juan Bautista fueron eso: preparar al pueblo de Dios para recibir al Mesías. Juan, pues, está con nosotros en este tiempo litúrgico signado por la esperanza. ¿Cómo se prepara uno para recibir a Jesucristo? Las recomendaciones de Juan en el evangelio de hoy conservan pleno valor. Juan predicó con su ejemplo, que consistió en austeridad y oración, y predicó con su palabra que consistió en arrepentimiento y ser justos. Esas cuatro cosas son las que necesitamos: una vida sobria, sin apego a lujos ni vanidades; una vida orante, que devuelva a Dios el lugar que le corresponde; una vida humilde, que reconozca que hemos fallado muchas veces, y una vida justa, que preste atención especialmente a los derechos de los más pequeños y de los desposeídos.

**Los Dos Bautismos.-** Un dato que mucha gente no sabe es que la santidad y la virtud de Juan sobrevivieron mucho tiempo en la memoria de sus contemporáneos. No faltaron incluso los que consideraron que Juan era mayor que Jesús, pues al fin y al cabo fue Jesús el bautizado y Juan el que lo bautizó: un signo que podría interpretarse como que el menor estaba recibiendo del mayor. Además, la vida de penitencia de Juan era notabilísima mientras que Jesús era, para estos efectos, un personaje mucho más "normal" y la gente tiende a pensar que ser muy anormal debe parecerse a ser muy santo. Todo esto viene a la frase final del Evangelio de hoy, frase que el evangelista ha conservado porque es uno de los varios testimonios que los cristianos sin duda utilizaron para aclarar el tema de los dos bautismos, o sea, si era más importante (o poderoso) bautizarse con el bautismo de Juan o con el bautismo cristiano. Juan dice en el texto de este domingo: "Ya viene detrás de mí uno que es más poderoso que yo, uno ante quien no merezco ni siquiera incli-

narme para desatarle la correa de sus sandalias. Yo los he bautizado a ustedes con agua, pero Él los bautizará con el Espíritu Santo." Esta frase aclara lo esencial: que Juan reconoce en Jesucristo a uno "más fuerte" pero que esa fuerza proviene de lo que Cristo trae a nuestra vida. Juan representa arrepentirse del mal que uno ha hecho, y eso es clave, pero no es todo. Más importante incluso es recibir un impulso, una vida nueva, que haga posible que de aquí en adelante uno obre de otra manera. Eso es lo que trae la efusión del Espíritu Santo, que es lo que finalmente viene a darnos Jesús.

**TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE.-** El día 9 de diciembre conmemoramos a san Juan Diego de México. Hace un par de años este indígena mesoamericano fue canonizado por su misión en las apariciones Guadalupeanas. Hubo controversia alrededor de su canonización porque había quienes insistían que Juan Diego nunca existió. Después de investigar, el Vaticano decidió que no sólo existió, sino que fue y es santo, digno de ser modelo e intercesor. Las investigaciones encontraron que el nombre indígena de Juan Diego era Cuauhtlatatzin, es decir "Águila que habla". Tal vez por este nombre tan significativo fue que los franciscanos lo bautizaron Juan Diego. El nombre Juan recuerda al apóstol, quien escribió el evangelio más místico y cuyo símbolo es el águila. Diego viene del apóstol Santiago o san Diego quien evangelizó a los españoles durante el siglo I. De cualquier manera, Juan Diego Cuauhtlatatzin se convirtió en el "Águila que habla" y anuncia el evangelio místico según Guadalupe, es "Águila que habla" de amor, paz, consuelo y desafío en una tierra conquistada, oprimida y llena de promesa. --Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Gl, OFM, Copyright (c) J. 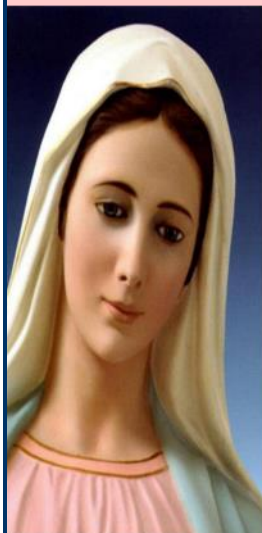
