



Sts. Joachim and Anne

July 26

In the Scriptures, Matthew and Luke furnish a legal family history of Jesus, tracing ancestry to show that Jesus is the culmination of great promises. Not only is his mother's family neglected, we also know nothing factual about them—except that they existed. Even the names *Joachim* and *Anne* come from a legendary source written more than a century after Jesus died.



The heroism and holiness of these people however, is inferred from the whole family atmosphere around Mary in the Scriptures. Whether we rely on the legends about Mary's childhood or make guesses from the information in the Bible, we see in her a fulfillment of many generations of prayerful persons, herself steeped in the religious traditions of her people.

The strong character of Mary in making decisions, her continuous practice of prayer, her devotion to the laws of her faith, her steadiness at moments of crisis, and her devotion to her relatives—all indicate a close-knit, loving family that looked forward to the next generation even while retaining the best of the past.

Joachim and Anne—whether these are their real names or not—represent that entire quiet series of generations who faithfully perform their duties, practice their faith, and establish an atmosphere for the coming of the Messiah, but remain obscure.

Reflection: This is the “feast of grandparents.” It reminds grandparents of their responsibility to establish a tone for generations to come: They must make the traditions live and offer them as a promise to little children. But the feast has a message for the younger generation as well. It reminds the young that older people’s greater perspective, depth of experience, and appreciation of life’s profound rhythms are all part of a wisdom not to be taken lightly or ignored.

St. Bridget of Sweden

July 23



From age 7 on, Bridget had visions of Christ crucified. Her visions formed the basis for her activity—always with the emphasis on charity rather than spiritual favors.

She lived her married life in the court of the Swedish king Magnus II. Mother of eight children—the second eldest was Saint Catherine of Sweden—Bridget lived the strict life of a penitent after her husband’s death.

Bridget constantly strove to exert her good influence over Magnus; while never fully reforming, he did give her land and buildings to found a monastery for men and women. This group eventually expanded into an Order known as the Bridgetines.

In 1350, a year of jubilee, Bridget braved a plague-stricken Europe to make a pilgrimage to Rome. Although she never returned to Sweden, her years in Rome were far from happy, being hounded by debts and by opposition to her work against Church abuses.

A final pilgrimage to the Holy Land, marred by shipwreck and the death of her son, Charles, eventually led to her death in 1373. In 1999, Bridget, Saints Catherine of Siena and Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, were named co-patronesses of Europe.

Reflection: Bridget’s visions, rather than isolating her from the affairs of the world, involved her in many contemporary issues, whether they be royal policy or the years that the legitimate Bishop of Rome lived in Avignon, France. She saw no contradiction between mystical experience and secular activity, and her life is a testimony to the possibility of a holy life in the marketplace.

Breaking Bread Homeless Ministries News From The Streets...

"No, is an Acceptable Answer"

It can be hard to say no. But it's a word that we may need to learn to use, and sometimes learn to use it wisely. My husband Walt started ministering to the homeless over 20 years ago. We have had many people ask us how we handle giving money to the homeless. The short answer is we don't give money! We choose to love them in other ways by blessing them with food, toiletries, clothing, and of course prayer. Walt will explain that "No, is an acceptable answer". We do tell people to first follow the Holy Spirit's prompting. And at times, the Lord may tell you to give money, and if it gives you great joy and peace - please obey that voice.

Peter himself used this word "no", when talking to a lame beggar in Acts 3:3. "When he saw Peter and John about to go into the temple, he began asking to receive alms." Verse 4: "But Peter, along with John, fixed his gaze on him and said, look at us!" So the man looked at them expecting to get something from them. Verse 6: "But Peter said I have no silver and gold, but I give you what I have; in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk!"...Instantly the man's feet and ankles were made strong. We carry the same message of Jesus Christ to those living on the streets. We have witnessed healings, reconciliations, but most of all love and forgiveness. We carry something much more valuable than money on the inside of us, and that is the name of Jesus - the name that is above every other name. Jesus is the only way out of life threatening situations. He's the good news we share with those we minister to. Put your hope in God. He's your provider, you're all in all. Without Him we can do nothing.

“EL SEÑOR ES MI PASTOR, NADA ME FALTA”

ANDABAN COMO OBEJAS SIN PASTOR



Marcos 6,30-34.- Damos la palabra al Doctor de la Gracia. Hoy damos la palabra a san Agustín de Hipona, llamado con razón el "Doctor de la Gracia", por su admirable y extensa exposición del amor divino y su obra redentora en nosotros. En efecto, tanto la primera lectura como el evangelio de este domingo traen a nuestra mente la imagen del pastor y de pastorear. Y hay un texto clásico en san Agustín, sobre este tema vital; es su sermón 46 "sobre los pastores". De él tomamos lo que sigue. La numeración es nuestra.

El nombre y la realidad.- Ya que hay pastores a quienes les gusta que les llamen pastores, pero que no quieren cumplir con su oficio, tratemos de examinar lo que se les dice por medio del profeta. Vosotros escuchad con atención, y nosotros escuchemos con temor. Me vino esta palabra del Señor: "Hijo de Adán, profetiza contra los pastores de Israel, profetiza diciéndoles." Acabamos de escuchar esta lectura; ahora podemos comentarla con vosotros. El Señor nos ayudará a decir cosas que sean verdaderas, en vez de decir cosas que sólo sean nuestras. Pues, si sólo dijésemos las nuestras, seríamos pastores que nos estaríamos apacentando a nosotros mismos, y no a las ovejas; en cambio, si lo que decimos es suyo, él es quien os apacienta, sea por medio de quien sea. Esto dice el Señor: "¡Ay de los pastores de Israel que se apacientan a sí mismos! ¿No son las ovejas lo que tienen que apacantar los pastores?" Es decir, que no tienen que apacentarse a sí mismos, sino a las ovejas. Ésta es la primera acusación dirigida contra estos pastores, la de que se apacientan a sí mismos en vez de apacentar a las ovejas. ¿Y quiénes son éstos que se apacientan a sí mismos? Los mismos de los que dice el Apóstol: Todos sin excepción buscan su interés, no el de Jesucristo. Por nuestra parte, nosotros que nos encontramos en este ministerio, del que tendremos que rendir una peligrosa cuenta, y en el que nos puso el Señor según su dignación y no según nuestros méritos, hemos de distinguir claramente dos cosas completamente distintas: la primera, que somos cristianos, y, la segunda, que somos obispos. Lo de ser cristianos es por nuestro propio bien; lo de ser obispos, por el vuestro. En el hecho de ser cristianos, se ha de mirar a nuestra utilidad; en el hecho de ser obispos, la vuestra únicamente. Son muchos los cristianos que no son obispos y llegan a Dios quizás por un camino más fácil y moviéndose con tanta mayor agilidad, cuanto que llevan a la espalda un peso menor. Nosotros, en cambio, además de ser cristianos, por lo que habremos de rendir a

Dios cuentas de nuestra vida, somos también obispos, por lo que habremos de dar cuenta a Dios del cumplimiento de nuestro ministerio. **Cuidar de los débiles y pequeños.-** "No fortalecéis a las ovejas débiles", dice el Señor. Se lo dice a los malos pastores, a los pastores falsos, a los pastores que buscan su interés y no el de Jesucristo, que se aprovechan de la leche y la lana de las ovejas, mientras que no se preocupan de ellas ni piensan en fortalecer su mala salud. Pues me parece que hay alguna diferencia entre estar débil, o sea, no firme -ya que son débiles los que padecen alguna enfermedad-, y estar propiamente enfermo, o sea con mala salud. Desde luego que estas ideas que nos estamos esforzando por distinguir las podríamos precisar, por nuestra parte, con mayor diligencia, y por supuesto que lo haría mejor cualquier otro que supiera más o fuera más fervoroso; pero, de momento, y para que no os sintáis defraudados, voy a deciros lo que siento, como comentario a las palabras de la Escritura. Es muy de temer que al que se encuentra débil no le sobrevenga una tentación y le desmorone. Por su parte, el que está enfermo es ya esclavo de algún deseo que le está impidiendo entrar por el camino de Dios y someterse al yugo de Cristo. Pensad en esos hombres que quieren vivir bien, que han determinado ya vivir bien, pero que no se hallan tan dispuestos a sufrir males, como están preparados a obrar el bien. Sin embargo, la buena salud de un cristiano le debe llevar no sólo a realizar el bien, sino también a soportar el mal. De manera que aquellos que dan la impresión de fervor en las buenas obras, pero que no se hallan dispuestos o no son capaces de sufrir los males que se les echan encima, son en realidad débiles. Y aquellos que aman el mundo y que por algún mal deseo se alejan de las buenas obras, éstos están delicados y enfermos, puesto que, por obra de su misma enfermedad, y como si se hallaran sin fuerza alguna, son incapaces de ninguna obra buena.
