

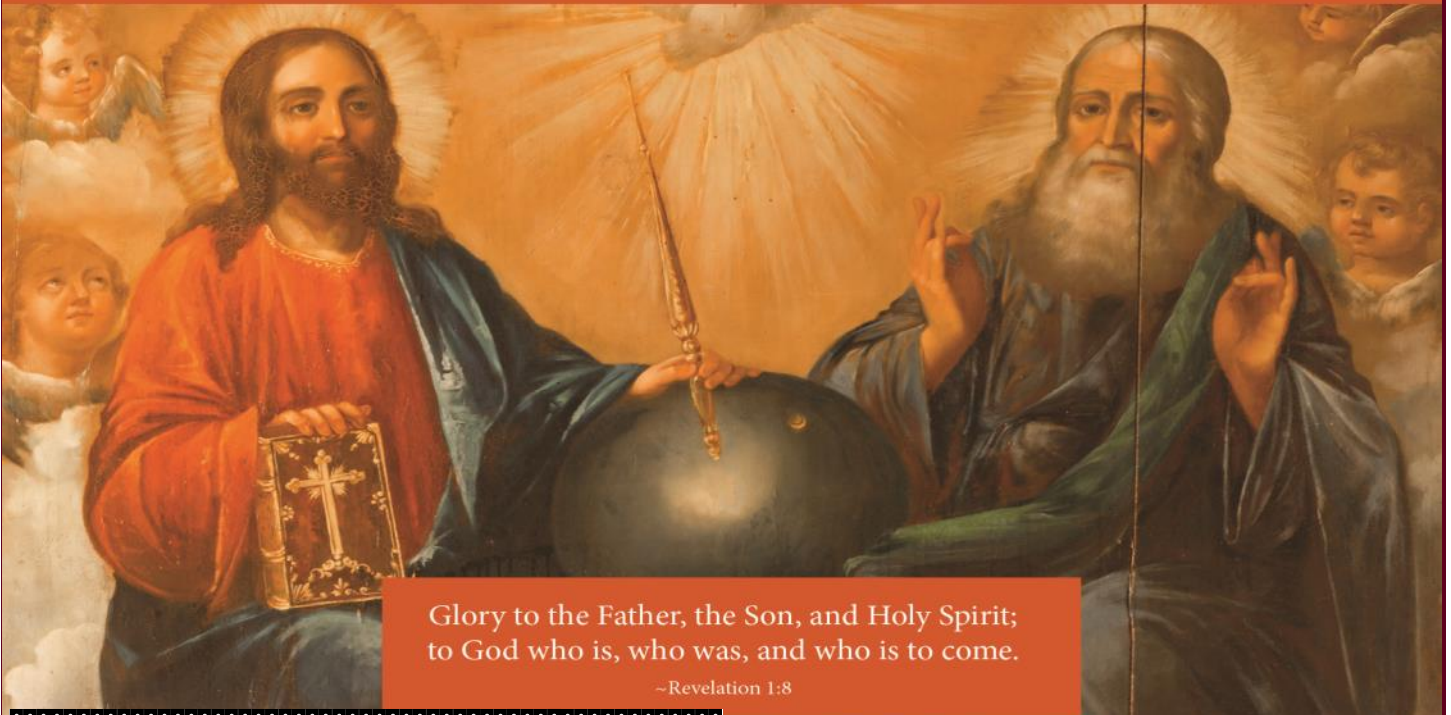

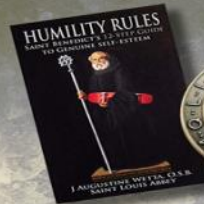

Saint John Fisher

Saint of the Day for June 23
(1469 – June 22, 1535)



John Fisher is usually associated with Erasmus, Thomas More, and other Renaissance humanists. His life therefore, did not have the external simplicity found in the lives of some saints. Rather, he was a man of learning, associated with the intellectuals and political leaders of his day. He was interested in the contemporary culture and eventually became chancellor at Cambridge. He had been made a bishop at 35, and one of his interests was raising the standard of preaching in England. Fisher himself was an accomplished preacher and writer. His sermons on the penitential psalms were reprinted seven times before his death. With the coming of Lutheranism, he was drawn into controversy. His eight books against heresy gave him a leading position among European theologians. In 1521, Fisher was asked to study the question of King Henry VIII's marriage to Catherine of Aragon, his brother's widow. He incurred Henry's anger by defending the validity of the king's marriage with Catherine, and later by rejecting Henry's claim to be the supreme head of the Church of England. In an attempt to be rid of him, Henry first had Fisher accused of not reporting all the "revelations" of the nun of Kent, Elizabeth Barton. In feeble health, Fisher was summoned to take the oath to the new Act of Succession. He and Thomas More refused to do so because the Act presumed the legality of Henry's divorce and his claim to be head of the English Church. They were sent to the Tower of London, where Fisher remained 14 months without trial. Finally both men were sentenced to life imprisonment and loss of goods.

When the two were called to further interrogations, they remained silent. On the supposition that he was speaking privately as a priest, Fisher was tricked into declaring again that the king was not supreme head of the church in England. The king, further angered that the pope had made John Fisher a cardinal, had him brought to trial on the charge of high treason. He was condemned and executed, his body left to lie all day on the scaffold and his head hung on London Bridge. More was executed two weeks later. His Liturgical Feast Day is June 22.

Reflection: Today many questions are raised about Christians' and priests' active involvement in social issues. John Fisher remained faithful to his calling as a priest and bishop. He strongly upheld the teachings of the Church; the very cause of his martyrdom was his loyalty to Rome. He was involved in the cultural enrichment circles as well as in the political struggles of his time. This involvement caused him to question the moral conduct of the leadership of his country. "The Church has the right, indeed the duty, to proclaim justice on the social, national and international level, and to denounce instances of injustice, when the fundamental rights of man and his very salvation demand it" (Justice in the World, 1971 Synod of Bishops).

"I wish more people would say hello to us." A homeless man said this to me while we waited for the walk light to change at a busy intersection. I turned, smiled, and responded, "I wish they would too!" As I made my way back to work he began to share with me what was on his heart - how he felt unwanted, and disheartened by the constant request to move on! I walked and listened to him and asked him if he had a relationship with the Lord Jesus to which he responded, "yes, and I read my bible every day." I then realized that I was looking into the face of a discouraged brother in Christ. We shared a little more, and as we parted ways, he didn't ask me for money, but just told me goodbye and have a great day.

When life gets hard remember to run to Him. King David tells his son Solomon (*known as the wisest man on the earth*) in I Chronicles 28:9 "Worship and serve him (God) with your whole heart and a willing mind. For the Lord sees every heart and knows every plan and thought. If you seek him, you will find him. "If we're honest with ourselves we've all had one of those days/weeks/or months when things weren't going right. 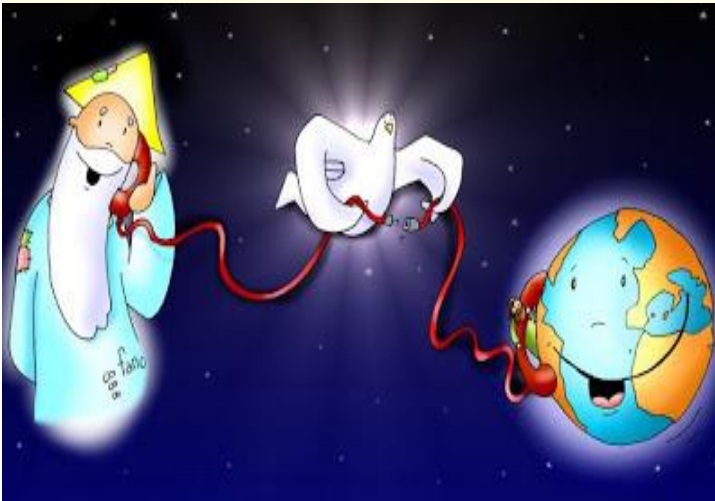

3, 10), a David (cf. 1 S 16, 13), al rey Mesías (cf. Is 11, 1-2; 42, 1), pero sobre todo es él quien se derrama sobre los profetas, los cuales tienen la misión de revelar la gloria divina velada en la historia, el designio del Señor encerrado en nuestras vicisitudes. El profeta Isaías presenta una página de gran eficacia, que recogerá Cristo en su discurso programático en la sinagoga de Nazaret: "El Espíritu del Señor Yahveh está sobre mí, pues Yahveh me ha ungido, me ha enviado a predicar la buena nueva a los pobres, a sanar los corazones quebrantados, a anunciar a los cautivos la liberación, y a los reclusos la libertad, y a promulgar el año de gracia de Yahveh" (Is 61, 1-2; cf. Lc 4, 18-19). El Espíritu de Dios no sólo revela el sentido de la historia, sino que también da fuerza para colaborar en el proyecto divino que se realiza en ella. A la luz del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu, la historia deja de ser una sucesión de acontecimientos que se disuelven en el abismo de la muerte; se transforma en un terreno fecundado por la semilla de la eternidad, un camino que lleva a la meta sublime en la que "Dios será todo en todos" (1 Co 15, 28). El jubileo, que evoca "el año de gracia" anunciado por Isaías e inaugurado por Cristo, quiere ser la epifanía de esta semilla y de esta gloria, para que todos esperen, sostenidos por la presencia y la ayuda de Dios, en un mundo nuevo, más auténticamente cristiano y humano. Así pues, cada uno de nosotros, al balbucear algo del misterio de la Trinidad operante en nuestra historia, debe hacer suyo el asombro adorante de san Gregorio Nacianceno, teólogo y poeta, cuando canta: "Gloria a Dios Padre y al Hijo, rey del universo. Gloria al Espíritu, digno de alabanza y todo santo. La Trinidad es un solo Dios, que creó y llenó todas las cosas..., vivificándolo todo con su Espíritu, para que cada criatura rinda homenaje a su Creador, causa única del vivir y del durar. La criatura racional, más que cualquier otra, lo debe celebrar siempre como gran Rey y Padre bueno" (Poemas dogmáticos, XXI, Hymnus alias: PG 37, 510-511)

Juan 16, 12-15.- La Gloria de la Trinidad en la Historia. El 9 de febrero del año 2000 el papa Juan Pablo II nos regaló una reflexión preciosa sobre la presencia del misterio trinitario en la historia. Ofrecemos un aparte de su enseñanza, aunque la numeración aquí presentada es nuestra. Trataremos de ilustrar esta presencia de Dios en la historia, a la luz de la revelación trinitaria, que, aunque se realizó plenamente en el Nuevo Testamento, ya se halla anticipada y bosquejada en el Antiguo. Así pues, comenzaremos con el Padre, cuyas características ya se pueden entrever en la acción de Dios que interviene en la historia como padre tierno y solícito con respecto a los justos que acuden a él. El es "padre de los huérfanos y defensor de las viudas" (Sal 68, 6); también es padre en relación con el pueblo rebelde y pecador. Dos páginas proféticas de extraordinaria belleza e intensidad presentan un delicado soliloquio de Dios con respecto a sus "hijos descarriados" (Dt 32, 5). Dios manifiesta en él su presencia constante y amorosa en el entramado de la historia humana. En Jeremías el Señor exclama: "Yo soy para Israel un padre (...) ¿No es mi hijo predilecto, mi niño mimado? Pues cuántas veces trato de amenazarlo, me acuerdo de él; por eso se conmueven mis entrañas por él, y siento por él una profunda ternura" (Jr 31, 9-20). La otra estupenda confesión de Dios se halla en Oseas: "Cuando Israel era niño, yo lo amé, y de Egipto llamé a mi hijo. (...) Yo le enseñé a caminar, tomándolo por los brazos, pero no reconoció mis desvelos por curarlo. Los atraía con vínculos de bondad, con lazos de amor, y era para ellos como quien alza a un niño contra su mejilla, me inclinaba hacia él y le daba de comer. (...) Mi corazón está en mi trastornado, y se han conmovido mis entrañas" (Os 11, 1. 3-4. 8).

Junto a nosotros.- Continúa enseñándonos el papa Juan Pablo II. De los anteriores pasajes de la Biblia debemos sacar como conclusión que Dios Padre de ninguna manera es indiferente frente a nuestras vicisitudes. Más aún, llega incluso a enviar a su Hijo unigénito, precisamente en el centro de la historia, como lo atestigua el mismo Cristo en el diálogo nocturno con Nicodemo: "Tanto amó Dios al mundo que le dio a su Hijo unigénito, para que todo el que crea en él no perezca, sino que tenga vida eterna. Porque Dios no ha enviado a su Hijo al mundo para juzgar al mundo, sino para que el mundo se salve por él" (Jn 3, 16-17). El Hijo se inserta dentro del tiempo y del espacio como el centro vivo y vivificante que da sentido definitivo al flujo de la historia, salvándola de la dispersión y de la banalidad. Especialmente hacia la cruz de Cristo, fuente de salvación y de vida eterna, converge toda la humanidad con sus alegrías y sus lágrimas, con su atormentada historia de bien y mal: "Cuando sea levandado de la tierra, atraeré a todos hacia mí" (Jn 12, 32). Con una frase lapidaria la carta a los Hebreos proclamará la presencia perenne de Cristo en la historia: "Jesucristo es el mismo ayer, hoy y siempre" (Hb 13, 8). Para descubrir debajo del flujo de los acontecimientos esta presencia secreta y eficaz, para intuir el reino de Dios, que ya se encuentra entre nosotros (cf. Lc 17, 21), es necesario ir más allá de la superficie de las fechas y los eventos históricos. Aquí entra en acción el Espíritu Santo. Aunque el Antiguo Testamento no presenta aún una revelación explícita de su persona, se le pueden "atribuir" ciertas iniciativas salvíficas. Es él quien mueve a los jueces de Israel (cf. Jc
