CHURCH

The Easter season provides us an opportunity to reflect upon who we are as Church, in light of the first experiences of Jesus' followers. From today's Gospel, we realize that all we do is founded on our friendship with and trust in Jesus, as witnessed in Jesus' dialogue with Peter. From Revelation, in the image of Jesus as the sacrificial Lamb, we can anticipate suffering for the sake of love for God and for others. From the apostles' bold speech in Acts, we remember that when we stay true to the Gospel, even at great cost, we must always embody God's forgiveness toward those who resist God's invitation. The early Church struggled to understand how to live the way of Jesus, and we can expect no less struggle for ourselves. And like them, we may also know the joy of growing friendship with God along the way.

OBEYING GOD

In the first chapters of Acts, the apostles venture out energetically, soon after Pentecost, to proclaim the risen Jesus. Today's reading shows the Sanhedrin, the formal religious body that had condemned Jesus shortly before, now threatening the apostles. The Sanhedrin likely feared that Jesus' followers would, in vengeance for the Crucifixion, stir up a riot or even a violent revolt. The apostles, consistent with Jesus' own dealings with the authorities, proclaim Jesus' message of God's forgiveness of everyone, and refuse to incite violence.

It is a great challenge, as Peter said, to "obey God rather than man." Throughout history, when groups of God's people, inspired by God's dream for a just and free world, have spoken out non-violently against injustice and oppression, they have sought to obey God's summons. We the Church, while always mindful of the dangers of self-deception, are similarly called to discern and obey God in our own time and place.

REPEATED QUESTIONS

In today's Gospel, John sets the scene for Jesus' encounter with Peter, sitting by a "charcoal fire." There is just one other mention of a charcoal fire in John's Gospel: when Peter warms himself while awaiting Jesus' trial, and Peter goes on to deny knowing Jesus, three times. The evangelist directly links Jesus' three questions of Peter, "do you love me?", to Peter's three denials. Through his repeated questioning, Jesus helps Peter to face his actions fully, and to accept forgiveness fully as well.

When God invites us into prayer, we may be invited to enter into deep conversation with God about our lives. God can pose the same questions to us, again and again over time, to face what we might prefer to avoid: Can you forgive someone who has hurt you? Can you be more generous? Can you let go of obstacles to becoming more loving? And even: Do you love me? Jesus' encounter with Peter suggests that we can face such questions with deep trust in God.

Get A Job ?

When I write the word April in my journal, it makes me smile... probably because it takes my mind to thoughts of spring, beautiful flowers, the resurrection and hope. Its spring time now and we are still emerging from this deadly pandemic. Lots of loved ones we had to say goodbye to. And we have many left wounded as well, not to mention...the survivors, who are now picking thru the broken pieces of their lives. We are all trying our best to return to normal. But what is normal? For those of us seasoned in the things of God—we fight the good fight of faith and remember He will always be our refuge and still sits on the throne.

We know that ministry must continue. I mean, that's what Jesus would do, right? And the Bible tells us that, Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever. — Heb. 13:8

So in our travels we find Trey (*not his real name*) the homeless believer laying on the grass by his wheelchair.

After receiving his provision of food for the day, we asked if he would like prayer—immediately he asked us to pray for his healing...we then noticed the gangrene that caused him to lose the toes on his left foot and was now starting to claim a few more on his right. There's an old expression I heard when I was young. "I used to feel sorry for myself, because I had no shoes—until I met the man who had no feet." Well on this day we met that expression face to face...just outside of downtown Houston.

For some reason, serving the homeless is not a very popular ministry. One opinion that pops up frequently is: "Why don't they just get a job—I mean, I gotta work...they need to work too." Now let's get back to Trey, who by the way was thanking God the whole time we were with him (*as he lay on his side*).

How is Trey supposed to get a job?

I call them believers because not all the homeless are heathens. Some were regular church goers at one time. They are just very broken and hurting, not only on the outside but on the inside as well. I like it when my husband reminds us about Mother Teresa (*one of our mentors*). She's got it! — When it came to loving the poor and homeless. Why don't we in the Western World get it too? Just like God's Word expresses to us all. Faith, hope, and love...but the greatest of these is love. — 1 Cor. 13:13

We all bowed our heads and invited God and his presence to heal his feet.

As we drove away I looked back at Trey and saw him immediately rip open a food product and begin to eat. He was famished. I'm glad we were there for him in his moment of need.

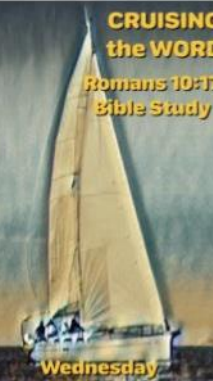

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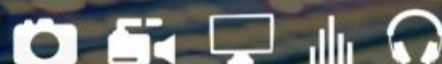

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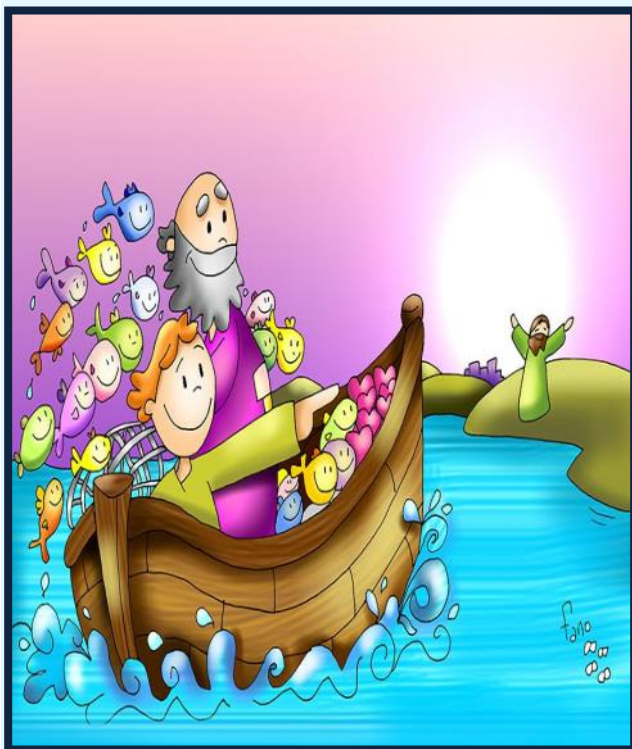

**JESÚS SE ACERCA, TOMA EL PAN Y
SE LO DA, Y LO MISMO EL**



San Juan 21,1-19. Aprender a Alabar.- Este tiempo de Pascua es como una prolongada contemplación de la gloria de Cristo y de su victoria. El Señor vive, se ha levantado de entre los muertos, y como él mismo dijo, una vez levantado, ha atraído a todos y a todo hacia sí. Cristo se levanta y con él el pueblo que confía en su Nombre; Cristo se levanta y su victoria da unidad a la creación ya renovada, para presentarla como ofrenda solemne en el altar del cielo. Pascua es el tiempo más propicio para reunir nuestras voces con los coros de los ángeles en el cielo. A todo lo largo de la Pascua descubrimos de manera nueva que no hay sino una Iglesia, que es el Cuerpo de Cristo, o mejor: el Cristo total, como gustaba de decir san Agustín de Hipona. Tales la grandiosa visión de la que escuchábamos en el texto de la segunda lectura: << Y todas las criaturas del cielo y de la tierra, de debajo de la tierra y del mar, oí que también decían: Al que está sentado en el trono y al Cordero, alabanza, honor, gloria y poder por los siglos.>> Y así como durante la Cuaresma nos ejercitábamos en el ayuno y el arrepentimiento de nuestras culpas, ahora, llegada la Pascua, se nos invita a ejercitarnos en la alabanza y en la acción de gracias, porque una cosa es

cierta: tanto necesita nuestro corazón aprender a alegrarse en el bien como necesita aprender a rechazar el mal. **Amor del Bueno.-** Los apóstoles ciertamente habían aprendido muy bien estas lecciones, pues, después de ser injusta y cruelmente azotados <> como oímos en la primera lectura de hoy. Fortalecidos por el don del Espíritu Santo, fueron capaces no sólo de dar testimonio sino de sufrir, e incluso gozarse en el sufrimiento, como un modo máximo de dar testimonio de Aquel que les concedía tal fortaleza y tal alegría. Todo, pues, depende de la calidad de amor que nos mueve, como lo muestra el evangelio de hoy. Tres veces negó Pedro a Jesús, cuando llegaba la hora suprema de la dolorosa Pasión; tres veces preguntó Jesús a Pedro si le amaba, cuando la tormenta había ya pasado. Aquel testimonio de amor tenía una razón de ser muy clara: sanar las heridas que habían causado el miedo, la vanidad y el orgullo. Y de aquí podemos tomar una segunda lección muy importante sobre el sentido del tiempo pascual: buscar amor que sea digno de ese nombre. De hecho, el tiempo pascual es como un inmenso arco tendido entre la Resurrección del Señor y Pentecostés. Estos límites cronológicos tienen una razón de ser: tanto la resurrección como la efusión maravillosa del Espíritu Santo son las más grandes expresiones del amor que vence sobre el pecado y la muerte.
