## **PASTOR'S PEN**

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we gather this Sabbath Day, we hear words from the mouth and heart of Jesus that give us all the strength and courage we need to be faithful to the Gospel and to build up God's kingdom in the midst of the trials and tribulations of life. We are confronted with the horrible reality of mass shootings in places of worship and schools, and the random violence in our community that claim the lives of innocent children and good adults.

In today's gospel, Jesus gives us good insight. When asked about the greatest commandment of the law, he says, "You shall love the lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 12:29-31). To love as God commands and Jesus teaches requires a spirit of humility that realizes we are all children of the same God who calls and blesses us all with no regard to race, ethnicity, religion or social or economic status. There is no greater sacrifice of praise we can make to God for his many blessings to us, no greater song of thanks we can offer than to honor God in those who, like each one of us, has been created in the divine image. To love as God loves demands every fiber of our being-our heart, our soul, our mind and our strength. The love of God forces us outside our comfort zones, compelling a "growth mindset" where we must put our own feelings and wants and desires on the line, to risk being hurt or misunderstood for the sake of our beloved Creator and God.

In creating us, God invites us to participate in the work of creation by embracing God's spirit of love. In today's gospel, Jesus lifts up such love as the very center of his Kingdom. Our devotion to God is not at all genuine unless it includes love, respect and compassion for our brothers and sisters; this commitment to others is incomplete without recognition of God as the Source of all love. It is in the compassion and kindness extended to our neighbors that our humanity most resembles God; it is in the respect and honor in which we hold others that we most praise the God of love; it is in acts of charity and selflessness that we mirror the love of God in our midst. In the twofold "Great Commandment" we discover a purpose to our lives much greater and larger than ourselves and our own selfcentered needs, interests, prejudices and biases. In loving God in one another we find the ultimate meaning and purpose of the gifts of life and faith.

May God's perfect love rest in our hearts, our homes, our neighborhoods and nation!


