PASTORAL REFLECTION

DIGGING DEEPER INTO TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Today, in our Gospel, Jesus urges Peter not to be afraid of his own sinfulness, his personal unworthiness. We hear Jesus' words, "Do not be afraid," again and again throughout the Scriptures. In the First Letter of John we are afforded a clue for Jesus' use of these words. The evangelist John tells us that "perfect love casts out fear." God desires perfect love in his relationship with us, and in perfect love there is no room for fear.

As we strive to live the life of the gospel, we are also called to practice persistence and perseverance. There are times in life when things seem hopeless. We have tried over and over to repair a relationship or to overcome a bad habit, but to no avail. Jesus tells Peter to put his nets into deeper water for a catch, and even though he has been fishing all night and caught nothing, he is obedient to Jesus' request. And his success is beyond his wildest imagining. He catches such an abundance of fish he must call on the other fishermen for assistance.

As we see in this encounter between Peter and Jesus our faith is one that is passed on through relationships. The last section of St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians is a discussion on the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Today we begin this discourse, which we will read for the next three Sundays. St. Paul cites the many people whom Jesus appeared to after the crucifixion. All of these people passed on what they had heard and seen to invite others to faith. Today, we believe because of what we have experienced, read, and most importantly, because of the testimony of others in our lives. And despite our own failings and weaknesses, we are called like Isaiah, Paul and Peter to witness to Jesus through our persistence, relationships and a love that casts out fear.

So it is fitting on this second Sunday of Black History Month that we remember and reverence our ancestors who have formed our lives through their faith and love.
