~PASTOR'S PEN~ Second Sunday of Advent

Dear Church Family,

On this Second Sunday of Advent I invite you to "Dream the World Better." Don't we all dream a world better when we will have defeated the virus, inaugurated a new president, and come closer to social and racial reconciliation in our nation and world. Reflect the words of African American poet Langston Hughes in his "I Dream A World:"

I dream a world where man no other man will scorn, where love will bless the earth and peace its paths adorn. I dream a world where all will know sweet freedom's way, where greed no longer saps the soul, nor avarice blights our day.

In his "I Have A Dream" speech during the 1963 March on Washington, Dr. King said, "We will not be satisfied until justice runs down like waters and righteousness like a mighty stream." The crowd responded to the emotion of the prophet Amos, and Dr. King's biographer, Taylor Branch reports that Dr. King could not bring himself to deliver the next line in his speech.

Some on the platform urged him on, and gospel singer Mahalia Jackson called out, "Tell 'em about the dream, Martin. Dr. King went on to preach!! His dream message took him from Amos to Isaiah, and he ended with the words, "I have a dream that one day, every valley shall be exalted."

Isaiah, Jesus, and Dr. King show us that words create reality. The word of Isaiah dreamed the world better, and then Jesus made those words real. Jesus is, for us, the Word of God made flesh, and we can be thankful that "the word of God will stand forever as reflected the words of Dr. King. Jesus forgives our sins, wipes the slate clean, straightens us out, and gives us hope for the future. All we have to do is receive him, believe in him and walk behind him. Jesus is the one that Isaiah was talking about when he said, "lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, heard of good news, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, 'Here is your God'" God is with us and now we "Dream the World Better"

Continue to pray for our country as we make the Presidential transition and dealing with the Coronavirus.

May the Lord bless and keep us all in his peace. Stay safe and stay connected to your church family. Father Moore
