PENTECOST

STM Family,

Today we celebrate the great day of Pentecost—the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church. We recognize and honor the Holy Spirit—that awesome and wonderful gift of the Father that the Son and Savior Jesus promised so long ago. The great news for all of us is that this Holy Spirit, who appeared like wind and fire, is still active and at work today through us!

Our scriptures reveal to us that along with gifting the disciples with peace and with the breath of the Holy Spirit, Jesus also commissions them for mission: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Following Jesus's crucifixion, fear kept the disciples locked away, but now they are sent to no longer live motivated by self- preservation or success, but in the same way Jesus was sent by the Father—in complete vulnerability, as a sacrifice and a sign of God's love and compassion for all the people of the world.

Throughout the seasons of Lent and Easter, we have been strengthened and fortified by our on-going conversion to the Lord through penance and prayer, and through our celebration of Jesus's triumph over sin and death these last fifty days. Now, we, too, are sent forth to live in the world in a different way than we did before. We are alive with the breath of the Holy Spirit. We, too, are to use our different gifts and talents to proclaim the power of the Resurrection and bear witness to Christ's forgiveness and peace in this world.

This is not an easy task. To be sent as Jesus was sent means to strip away all of the human armor and the personal baggage we carry as we work to protect ourselves. In St. Paul's message (our second reading today) we are exhorted to renounce "hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, outbursts of fury, acts of selfishness, dissensions, factions of envy...and the like." All of these are counter to the nonviolence of Christ who opened his arms on the cross in loving sacrifice and surrender. Today, on this great day of Pentecost, let us again open our hearts and minds to the Holy Spirit that we will be renewed and revived as we follow in Jesus' footsteps, the same footsteps that led to the vulnerability of the cross and also the glory of the Resurrection.

<u>Please pray the Pentecost Empowerment Prayer that we may bear the good fruit of the Holy Spirit today, and every day:</u>

Loving Lord,

here I am, just as I am.

I trust that you have incredible plans for me.

So, transform me. Empower me. Use me!

Everything is on the table.

Take what you want to take.

And give what you want to give

so that I can live the life you envision for me.

I hold nothing back.

I am 100% available.

So, dear God, send your Holy Spirit upon me

that I may build your Kingdom in my words and work.

Through Christ our Lord. AMEN!
