## ~PASTOR'S PEN~

# Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time STM Family,

Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Come to Jesus and taste and see the goodness of the Lord. Unfortunately for many of us, we have been reluctant to come to Jesus—the Bread of Life. He shows up each Sunday at Mass. But some of our church family are still not ready to return to Sunday Mass. We can hear the word, we can sing his praises on livestream. BUT we cannot receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist in the virtual Mass. We have been averaging around 80 people in the sanctuary. The question that confronts us all is "when am I going to return to Mass and the Eucharist?"

Also consider these questions:

In our first reading (I Kings 19:4-8) Elijah tells God, "This is enough, O Lord!" In the life of faith, when have you struggled with despair and what gave you strength to continue on?" Maybe it was Jesus in the Eucharist. Today's responsorial psalm invites us to "taste and see the goodness of the Lord." What memories do you have of the first time you encountered the risen Lord in the Eucharist? In the second reading, St. Paul urges the Ephesians to "be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ." How do you strive to treat those who have harmed you with compassion and forgiveness? In the gospel Jesus quotes the prophets: "They shall all be taught by God." In the life of faith, how do you continue to be open to learning more and more?

Hopefully, you will find the courage to venture back to Church and the Eucharist. Also, prepare your hearts for our 32nd East of the River Revival on October 4th. Please pray the *Revival Prayer* every day as we anticipate our Annual Revival with Father Robert Boxie, chaplain at Howard University. The theme this year is "In The Midst of It All."
