~ HOMILY POINTS ~

- We are reminded in Acts that the power of the Spirit comes from God and exists only for his sake; the gift of tongues is given for evangelization, to bring all peoples back to God! Like the apostles, God offers us the Holy Spirit at baptism and at confirmation, so that we can offer our gifts, through Christ, to the Father of nations.
- The Holy Spirit dwells with us and teaches us the wisdom of God from age to age. Saint André Bessette, a Holy Cross brother from Montreal, once said, "Put yourself in God's hands; he abandons no one." This is what the Spirit means for us. We are forever accompanied by the power and presence of God, who showers us with his gifts so that we can be converted and convert others in turn. Just as God never abandons us, so we must never abandon others in fidelity to his Spirit.
- The Christian life, the road we walk when we turn away from sin and are faithful to the gospel, is always uncharted territory. The Holy Spirit is our compass and our guide. When we lose our way, it is the Spirit that gently (or firmly) guides us back to Christ and his church. It is the quiet but potent voice that whispers within us, reminding us of our origins and our destiny in Christ. Seeking forgiveness is often the first step in learning how to become a child of God more fully. Once freed of our obstacles to God and his work, we can see the way forward with greater ability and stronger resolve, both of which are from God. The Spirit of truth, which leads us and teaches us, is also the strength that helps us to walk toward Christ our goal!


