~ HOMILY POINTS ~

• The law of the Lord is already in our mouths and in our hearts. We need only to carry it out. How well do we know the interior of our hearts? How crowded are our minds and days that our spirits are strangled—unable to speak, let alone hear the word of God first inscribed on our hearts in baptism? God's law—loving God and loving our neighbor with mercy—is made known to us again this day. Do we have ears to hear what is already within our hearts?

• Christ Jesus is with God in the beginning, the image of the invisible God. All things were created through him and for him. When we say we are made in *imago Dei* (the image of God), we also say that we are the image of Christ. But being in Christ's image means more than a pretty picture. We are united with Christ as Christ's Body here on earth. To be one with the creator demands that we care for creation. We are called to order the world with goodness, to extend mercy to all living creatures, and to care for and cultivate our world with as much attention as we do our spirits.

• A scholar of the law prompts Jesus to tell an imaginationstoking parable: the Good Samaritan. But what happened to the scholar of the law after having heard this story? Did the scholar become a disciple? Or did the scholar go on with daily life? We might happily receive the conclusion that the parabolic "Good Samaritan" was the correct choice. But the story is not about the fictional Samaritan. It is about us: we are the scholar of the law. How do we receive this word of Jesus? Does it cause us to act with mercy? To change our perspective? To ask new questions of Christ Jesus?
