Letter From Fr. Curtis

Dear Parishioners,

This Tuesday, September 15, we commemorate Our Lady of Sorrows. On this day we meditate upon the seven sorrows of Mary:

1. The prophecy of Simeon
2. The flight into Egypt
3. Losing Jesus for three days when he was in the Temple
4. Meeting Jesus on his way to Calvary
5. Jesus' crucifixion and death
6. Jesus' being taken down from the Cross
7. Jesus being laid in the Tomb



The tradition is to pray one Our Father, seven Hail Marys, and a Glory Be for each of Mary's sorrows. It can be a good practice to call to mind our own sorrows or those of our loved ones as we meditate upon these painful events in the life of Mary, spiritually joining our sorrows to hers, and praying for them to be alleviated.

We do not remain in sorrow, however. The day before, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast day reminds us that Jesus has taken on our sins and sorrows in His cross, and has won the victory over them. If we offer up our lives to Jesus with love, we are able to share in the victory of His cross.

“Take this and eat it, all of you”: communion

1384 The Lord addresses an invitation to us, urging us to receive him in the sacrament of the Eucharist: “Truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.” (John 6:53)

1385 To respond to this invitation we must prepare ourselves for so great and so holy a moment. St. Paul urges us to examine our conscience: “Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For any one who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself.” Anyone conscious of a grave sin must receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before coming to communion.
